Home And School Ass'n Meeting At Montague

Dr. G. S. A. Inman presided at the regular meeting of the Home and School Association held last night in the Montague High School.

The large number of members discussed several questions pertaining to the new projector which the Association has purchased for the school. It was felt that the addition of this new projector to the teaching facilities of the school would be of great advantage, this method having been advocated by leading educators throughout the Dominion and the United States. A book was presented to the meeting containing a list of some 900 films available from the National Film Board which are at the disposal of the school. Those who are acquainted with teaching will appreciate the tremendous advantage of using this education to teach many principles which are more easily taught than by any other possible method. Montague School has been placed in the distinct position of having a projector for its own use, and the members of the Home and School Association are to be duly commended for their initiative and foresight.

A Halloween party was also planned for the entertainment of the kiddies, and a committee, comprising Archie Hickey, Carl Boehner, Eric Duvar, and Mrs. Eithan Stewart, was appointed to organize the party.

Other discussions concerned black-out curtains for the projector room, and organizing extra-curricular school activities. In connection with this Mrs. Ralph Beck yesterday organized singing classes in the school, and it is expected that other phases of arts and crafts will also be arranged in the near future so as to provide the pupils with something more practical in school work. Following the discussions, Mr. Eric Duvar showed several films of an educational and entertaining nature to the members.

"SPECIAL DENTAL CLINIC"—A special dental clinic was held in the Montague High School yesterday afternoon, and will be continued for the next few days until all the children of the school have had their teeth examined. Dental hygienists, Theima Reid, Annabelle Allen and Dorothy Galant, conducted the examination of the primary grades yesterday. Dr. B. J. O'Meara, director of the dental division of the Department of Health and Welfare, has spent considerable time organizing this dental survey of the children in the schools of the island, and it is expected that, with the cooperation of the parents and teachers, much of the early tooth decay will be noticed in time so that attention will be given to the child's teeth before the condition has progressed too far.
