Power, Telephone Service Restored In Montague Area

Montague and surrounding areas were cut off from electric power and telephone communications on Tuesday evening at approximately 5 p.m. when a sleet storm broke communication wires between Montague and Charlottetown. Several breaks occurred in the power line, the main one being centred at Millville. Power was restored at 1 a.m. Wednesday, much to the relief of many householders who were without heat for eight hours. However, after about an hour the power went out again until almost 11 a.m. Telephone and telegraph communications were not established until yesterday evening, when all breaks in the lines had been repaired.

However, the work was no sooner accomplished when the area was visited on Tuesday by a sleet storm and high winds which soon had the highways again impassable. Plows worked constantly yesterday to open traffic routes, and it is expected that all roads will be passable today.

Gruvys also tallied five scores, Andrews two and Code, Frizzell, MacFarlane Tremere and Coles one each. In the dressing room the Meteors felt the temporary loss of their mascot and moral builder Erucle Clair, who is ill at his home at present. The team members hope to see him back on the job shortly.

(Continued from Page 1) threat of aggression, and to seek peace by following the "hard road" between war and appeasement. "Peace is our goal—not peace at any price, but a peace based on freedom and justice," he said. To Increase Armed Forces Truman threw out a hint of possibly higher taxes. He said he will soon ask for an increase in the country's armed forces, notably in air power. And he called for stronger economic controls and enactment of "a strong anti-inflation law." The first round of applause during his 40-minute speech came when the President spoke forcefully of keeping up the fight in Korea "until we get the kind of armistice that will put an end to the aggression and protect the safety of our armed forces" there. Truman gave no hint whether he will run for re-election.
