Let's Talk It Over

It is to be hoped that a special train can be obtained to take the Prince County Hospital children to Charlottetown on November 9. Certainly buses will not be able to handle the large number that will want to see the royal couple, and who will have no other means of conveyance. The authorities concerned should realize that this journey to the capital city to get a glimpse of the beloved Princess and her husband can be classed among the things that happen only once or twice in a life time. No child desirous of making the trip should be denied the privilege.

Narrow escapes should be sufficient to point to the need of a safety precaution. We should not have to wait for a tragic accident. Everybody will probably agree that there are far too many blind railway crossings in Summerside without warning signals. But nothing is being done about it. Some day the coincidence of time and place will follow its unchanging law and we shall have a fatality at one of those crossings. There is no better way of spending public funds than to establish precautionary measures for the safety of life and limb.

The humble, peace-loving man who goes out of his way to avoid a quarrel, who gives a soft answer to the voices of wrath, will sometimes succeed in leading the peaceful life he desires if he lives in a community where law-abiding citizens prevail. If he lives among brigands, he is adopting the worst possible attitude to maintain the peace. A show of strength and a disposition to look after one's interests is the proper course then. So it is on the international scene. Humility, appeasement, compromise seem but to inflame the adversary to rash action.

Britain gives in to Iran rather than run the risk of world-wide conflict. Immediately Egypt and Iraq are ready to fly at her throat, and the world is brought nearer the brink of world war because of Britain's conciliatory attitude. "Turn the other cheek" is a good rule for Christian individuals to follow. Christian nations must turn the muzzles of their guns towards their opponents and get ready to use them. Only in this way, apparently, will they have a chance to avoid their use.

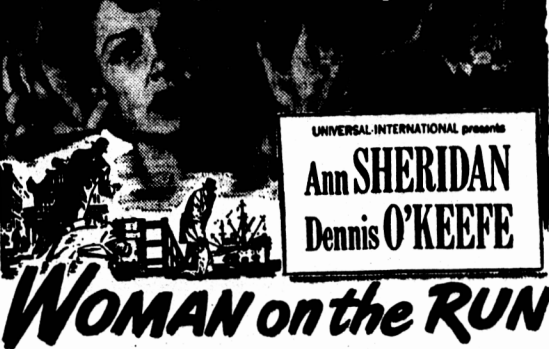
