Mr. Edgett is also interested in holding a card in Nova Scotia with Island lads pitted against members of his clubs. He maintains that his amateurs are willing to battle with other amateurs anywhere.

Trainor has a few boys working out under his instruction at the present time and is being assisted by Jimmy Poulton. Poulton is ranked fourth in the Dominion in the junior welter-weight division, but was knocked out of competition last summer with a stomach ailment.

Montreal Signs Toe Blake To New One Year Contract

MONTREAL (CP) — Hector (Toe) Blake, who threatened to retire while still piloting a winner, Monday signed a one-year contract with Montreal Canadiens to guide the fortunes of the Stanley Cup champions for the 1965-66 season.

Blake, 52, entering his 11th year at the helm, is the National Hockey League's most successful coach, guiding Canadiens to six Stanley Cup championships and seven first-place finishes in 10 seasons.

His Stanley Cup record is one better than that of Clarence (Hap) Day, who had five winners while with Toronto Maple Leafs.

A recent clean bill of health, coupled with the team's success in the past season, were contributing factors in Blake's decision to return.

Terms of the contract were not revealed but following his meeting with general manager Sam Pollock, Blake said he is "very happy with the conditions of the pact."

Blake, who took over from the late Dick Irvin in 1955 promptly led the Canadiens to five consecutive Stanley Cup winners.

Throughout the season just ended, he had been reported undecided as to his future with the club.

During the playoff series with Chicago, he several times brushed questioning reporters back with a brusque, "This is no time to talk about retiring."

Following the Stanley Cup victory, Blake met with Canadiens' president David Molson to discuss plans for the coming season. At that time the coach insisted his decision was contingent on the results of exhaustive physical tests.

Donag Tackler went the distance for the RCAF in picking up the win. Dave Campbell took the loss.

Gill DesRoches and Monty Campbell led Kensington's attack with two doubles apiece.

Blake has an enviable record besides his Stanley Cup victories and league championship. Since he took over, the club has won 382 games in the regular schedule, while losing only 187 and tying 128.

His NHL coaching debut was an auspicious year as the club whipped through the 1955-56 season with 45 wins, and 10 ties in 70 games for 100 points. That total has been beaten once and equalled only once in NHL history.

During his playing days Blake scored 235 goals while teamed with Elmer Lach and Maurice (Rocket) Richard. He was selected four times to the first all-star team and twice on the second.

Jim Clark Wins Indy 500; Billy Foster Forced Out

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Jim Clark of Scotland drove his green-and-yellow Lotus Ford to a record triumph in the U.S. Memorial Day 500-mile auto race Monday, becoming the first foreign winner of the classic in 49 years.

He did it in style, coming in waving a black-gloved hand above the cockpit of his car, about five miles ahead of 1963 winner Parnelli Jones of Torrance, Calif., and setting a record of 150.686 miles an hour for the average time of the old speedway oval.

Jones coasted over the finish line out of fuel. The result reversed the 1963 finish, when Jones edged Clark while the Lotus owner, Colin Chapman of London, was demanding that Jones be disqualified for leaking oil.

Clark's car was the first foreign chassis to win since Wilbur Shaw's 1940 victory in an Italian Maserati, but the Scot's car was powered by a special Ford engine.

Clark is the first foreign winner of the 500 since Dario Resta of Italy took first in 1916 in a French Peugeot.

Italian-born Mario Andretti, now of Nazareth, Pa., led a brilliant field of rookies with a

third-place finish in all-American Brawner Ford.

FOSTER FORCES OUT Billy Foster, the 27-year-old rookie from Victoria who May 16 had become the first Canadian to qualify for the 500, failed to finish the race.

He was forced out at the 90th lap when his \$40,000 rear-engine Offenhauser broke a water line. Foster, a car dealer in Victoria who had planned before the race to join the racing circuit fulltime whatever the outcome Monday, had qualified with an average time of 138.416 m.p.h.

He had been considered one of the brightest hopes among the rookies and a possible threat to the potential leaders.

Foster's Offy was one of two cars which got off to a late start. Both he and Masten Gregory of Rome, in a Bryant BRP-Ford, finally got off to the roar of the crowd and caught the field before the parade lap was completed.

Foster was holding down eighth place at the 50-mile mark but started losing ground after that and by the 100-mile mark was out of the top 10 leaders.

The race was free of serious accidents and injuries, as contrasted to last year's tragic accident which took the lives of drivers Eddie Sachs and Dave

McDonald. But there was a heavy toll of cars in the race, witnessed by a crowd of more than 220,000.

Andretti was followed by Al Miller, Standish, Mich., fourth in a Lotus Ford; Gordon Johncock, Hastings, Mich., fifth in a Ford; rookie Mickey Rupp, Mansfield, Ohio, sixth in a Gerhardt Offy; Don Branson, Champaign, Ill., seventh in a Watson-Ford.

Then came 45-year-old Walt Hansgen, Bedminster, N.J., eighth in a Huffaker Offenhauser; rookie Al Unser, Albuquerque, N.M., ninth in a Lola-Ford; and Eddie Johnson, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, 10th in an old Offy roadster.

The only other car still running at the finish in the machinery-wrecking race was a

Vollstedt Ford driven by Len Sulton of Portland, Ore.

Both Jones and Andretti broke A. J. Foyt's 1964 record of 147.35 m.p.h. Jones averaged 149.2 and Andretti 149.121.

The 11 finishers were one fewer than last year, but seven cars in the 1964 field were eliminated in the explosive second-lap crash which killed Sachs and McDonald.

There was only one wreck of consequence. Bud Tingstad of Dayton, Ohio, hit the wall with his Lola Ford a little past the midway point but climbed out unhurt.

Defending champion Foyt, of Houston, gave Clark his only serious competition, and it ended when the transmission failed on the U.S. Auto Club champion's modified Lotus Ford after 115 laps.

Clark led 190 of the 200 laps and won \$28,500 in lap prizes alone and \$150 for each one he led. Foyt led the other 10.

The full amount of the purse and its division will not be known until the victory dinner Tuesday night. It amounted to more than \$500,000 last year.

The finish also will be unofficial until after an all-night check of the timers' tapes, but it's highly unlikely that officials can find any other winner than the quiet Scotsman.

The tire troubles of the preliminaries obviously had been solved. Firestone, which had had its product on the winner every year since 1919, did it again. But Goodyear, returning to the line-up for the first time since 1922, put tires on the cars of Branson and Al Unser.

RIFLE SHOOT AT YORK

Tr. Eldon MacLean won the Vespyr Seeds match at Squaw Point Range Saturday afternoon. Shooting under ideal weather conditions, he and Captain Roy McCabe posted the highest scores to date this year.

Strangely enough they both made
