

Patty Wins Men's Tennis Crown At Wimbledon

 WIMBLEDON, England, July 8 (AP) — Budge Patty, one-time international playboy who says he's a changed man, won the coveted men's singles title today in the all-England lawn tennis tournament.

The tall, dark and handsome Californian defeated young, shy, blonde Frankie Sedgman of Melbourne, Australia, 6-1, 8-10, 6-2, 6-3, in the final.

Nobody in the crowd of 20,000 that jammed the centre court arena was left with a single doubt as to the better player.

Patty beat Sedgman on service, was far superior on passing shots down the sidelines and was more than a match for him at the net—Sedgman's strongest point.

"Just say it's all because I gave up smoking," Patty said after the match. "If I hadn't done that I wouldn't have gotten past the third round."

Patty won eight of the first nine games and Sedgman, who had his death's door recoveries in both the quarter and semi-finals, dug in for yet a third breathtaking comeback.

For a brief moment it looked as if he might make it. He broke Patty's service to square the second set at four games each and then hung on to level again at 8-8 after Patty had taken the 15th game off his service. Finally Sedgman won the set at 10-8.

Although he had squared the match he was through. At 2-2 and again at 2-4 he lost his service in the third set and Patty tucked it away, 6-2.

Patty never gave Sedgman a chance from then on.

WASHINGTON, July 8 (AP) — The National Boxing Association told Italy's Tiberio Mitri that if he wins the middleweight boxing championship from Jake LaMotta in New York July 12 he will have to fight Sugar Ray Robinson within 90 days.

N. B. A. Commissioner Abe Green said that the middleweight crown will be lifted from the winner of the LaMotta-Mitri bout if the victor does not meet the welterweight king within the allotted time.

Mitri signed to meet LaMotta for the title after Graziano withdrew due to an injury.

In releasing its quarterly ratings, the N. B. A. rated Robinson the top contender for LaMotta's crown. It ranked Mitri second with Australia's Dave Sands and Laurent Deaulhulle of France, who now fights out of Montreal, third and
