Local Delegates To Attend Meet On ARDA

Three delegates from the province will attend a federal-provincial conference in Montreal in November, during which changes in the agricultural rehabilitation and development act will be discussed.

The delegates will be Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae, Deputy Minister S. C. Wright and Research Director Reid Sangster. The meeting was called by Mr. Maurice Sauve, federal minister in charge of the ARDA administration. All ministers responsible for ARDA policies in their provinces will attend.

Agricultural officials here are hopeful that the conference will result in changes in the federal-provincial agreement providing for Ottawa to pay a larger share of the cost of approved ARDA projects.

One official said today that while a number of projects have been approved for Prince Edward Island, there are larger projects being held until after the conference for submission in case the federal government decides next month to pay a larger share of approved projects.

The Montreal Conference will follow a federal-provincial committee of agriculture ministers in Ottawa, scheduled to begin Nov. 21.
