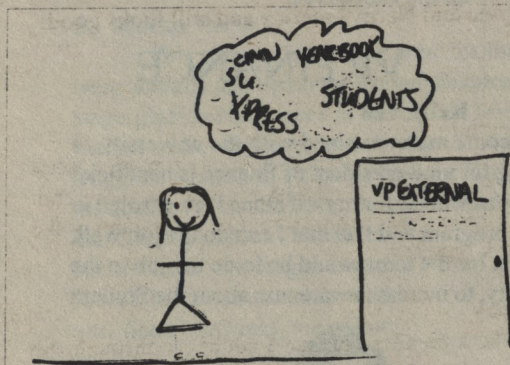


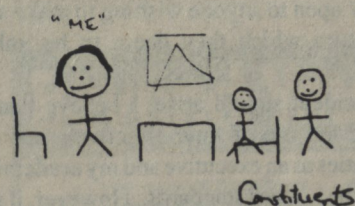
that I can take an active part in working with others to promote such important organizations as CIMN, the X-Press, and the yearbook to more students.

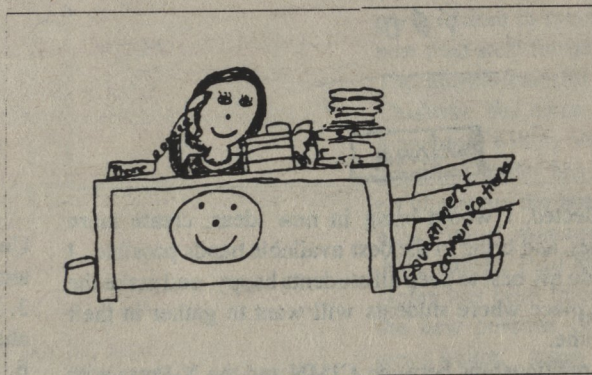
issues and form a close relationship with the campus community.

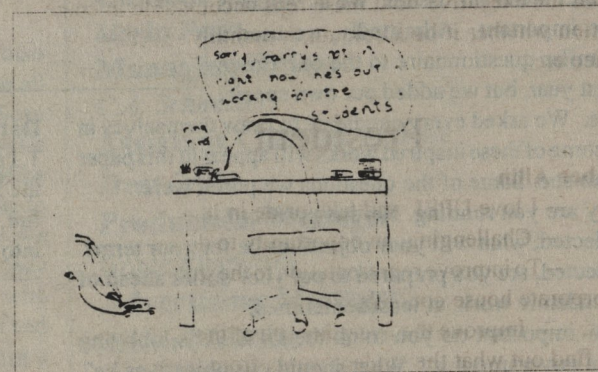
1. I believe the position of V.P.E. will have an important role in the up coming 12 months, and that more emphasis needs to be put on lobbying then there has been in the past.
