SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Gaylord Perry won his 12th game of the season Monday with a 3-2 victory over St. Louis after the Cardinals took the doubleheader opener 6-2, beating Juan Marichal for the second time in six days.

Perry won his seventh straight, boosting his record to 12-1 in the nightcap. He allowed seven hits and survived Mike Shannon's second run homer of the day, a seventh-inning liner that hit the screen on the left field foul pole.

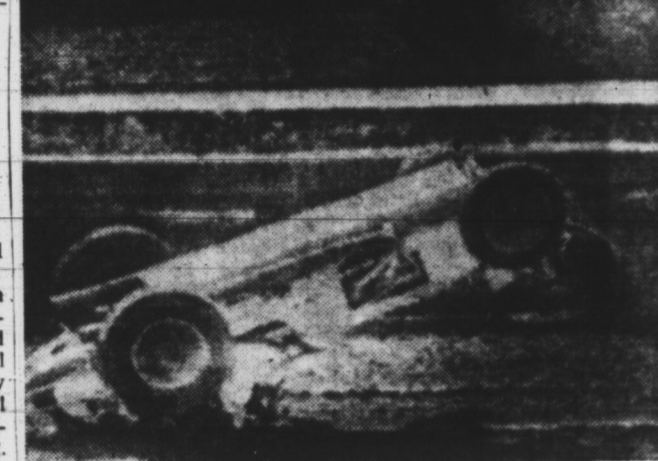
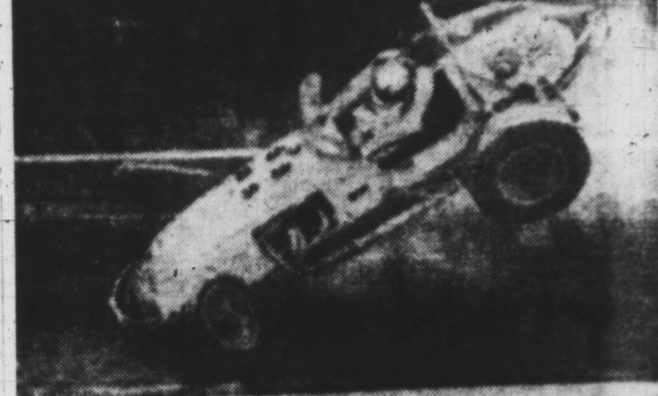
