London "Slave Girl" Tells Of 101-Day Ordeal Underground

LONDON (Reuters) — Slim, blue-eyed Marjorie Jordan, 28, testified Friday that a strange young Londoner forced her to live 101 days as a 'slave girl,' part of the time naked, in an underground chamber dug in his back garden.

The prosecution said the case against laborer John Bridal, 26, was "not very usual." Bridal appeared at a preliminary hearing on charges of unlawfully imprisoning the woman against her against her will and assaulting her, "causing actual bodily harm." He was ordered held for another hearing next week.

Miss Jordan, a chemical research worker, said she was a stranger to her when he suddenly appeared in her bedroom at 3 a.m. last Jan. 8, gagged and bound her and whisked her away on his motorcycle to his suburban London home.

Prosecutor Maxwell Turner told the court: "If one can understand this case at all, what he wanted was a sort of unpaid servant. His attitude was almost that of a slave master toward a slave."

Miss Jordan said Bridal did not commit any sexual offense against her during her imprisonment in the concrete-walled room nearly 10 feet below ground. On a few occasions Bridal put his arms around her, she related. "I told him not to do it, that I didn't like it, and then he would stop," she said.

New Freedoms Are Making Ex-Hungarians Forget Terrors

QUEBEC (CP) — Freedom is giving Imre Gregor and his family a chance to forget the past and to look eagerly to the future. Mr. Gregor, a 3-year-old former member of the Hungarian parliament, fled the country with his wife Julia and daughter Clara, 9, after the 1956 revolution.

While in Hungary, where he worked as a machinist, the family lived with Imre's parents because he could not afford a home and furniture of his own. Now they live in a modest apartment. GOOD BEGINNING

"I am only three months in Canada and I have my own home," he says proudly. "It is not much but it is beginning." In Budapest, Imre and his wife had an income of 2,400 forints a month—about \$200. "We earned more than the average but we could buy only three pairs of shoes with that amount."

"In Canada you can save and buy whatever you want. In Hungary you can never save because you don't earn enough and you cannot buy whatever you want because you cannot find it."

The Gregor apartment still lacks some furnishings. The family used an ice-box during the winter but this spring a refrigerator was bought. The Gregors appreciate the opportunity to earn these things. Most evenings the family gathers around the kitchen table for an English lesson. Imre knows a little now and helps his wife and daughter. Clara is also learning French at the school she attends in Quebec.

FREE TO MOVE Imre hopes to increase his earnings after he has improved his English and knows he is free to change his job or his location—a fact that still holds some amazement for him.

Northwest Territories Get Extra Federal Grant

FROBISHER BAY, N.W.T. — area is moving in from Ontario (CP)—The Northwest Territories is to get an extra \$25,000 a year for the next five years under a new financial agreement with the federal government. This was disclosed today by R. G. Robertson, deputy northern affairs minister and commissioner of the territories, as he read the opening address to the N.W.T. council's summer meeting here.

Mr. Robertson said the estimated average annual expenditures for the territorial government over the next five years will exceed estimated average annual revenues by \$564,000. Because of this, he said, the northern administration — which holds the controlling rein of territorial government — was recommending that the federal government grant an amount in addition to the approximate \$300,000 a year it has been paying for territorial administration.
