The Queen's Home life moves in even fashion. A busy woman must have regular hours for the despatch of business, certain times and seasons for family and domestic duties, and yet sufficient rest to preserve the vital functions in entirety.

The day begins early. Her Majesty is always awakened at eight o'clock by the "dresser," whose duty it is to do so.

The Queen has four personal maids, two dressers, and two wardrobe maids.

One of these always sleeps in the ante-room outside of the Queen's bedroom. The curtains of her sleeping chamber are very heavy and exclude the early morning light. The windows are generally left open during the night.

Tae, chocolate, and coffee are always in readiness at eight o'clock, with dry toast and plain biscuits. The letters of her family who have the privilege of putting autographs on the envelopes, are placed on a revolving table by the bedside, with a small plain ivory paper-knife, which was in her possession as the Princess Victoria.

The Queen's earliest question to her attendant is respecting the weather, and she will very frequently plan an expedition from what she hears. At half-past nine, her Majesty breakfasts, but the chief meal of the day is luncheon.

It is at luncheon that you see the Queen at her best. She is then generally in the best of spirits, full of clever anecdote, and asking many questions of and about the members of her family. The writer has often heard the Queen's voice. It is sweet, melodious, cultivated, low, musical, yet

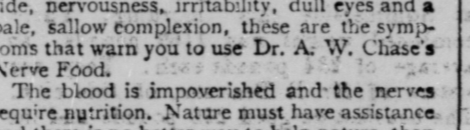

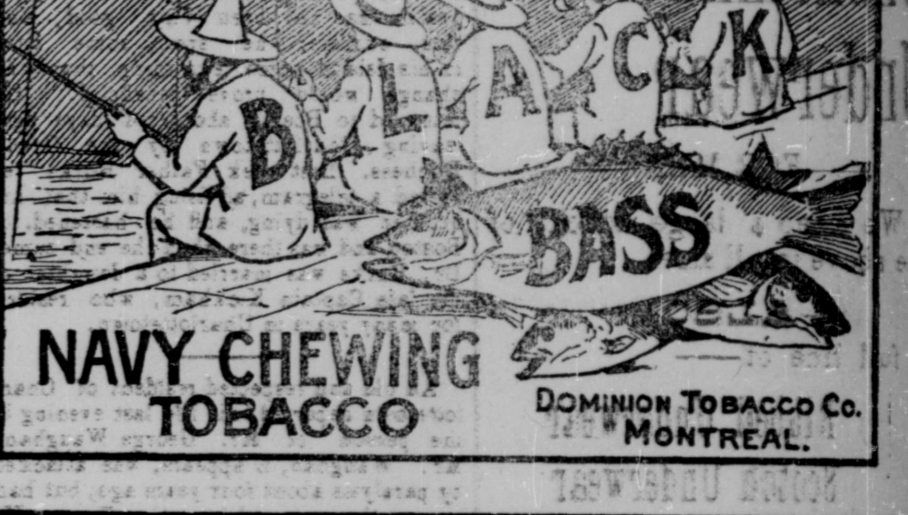
