POLITICAL BACKGROUND

Grace MacInnis is the eldest of six children of the late J. S. Woods, worth, for whose biography she won the UBC Medal. She graduated from University of Manitoba in 1938 and was working in her father's office at Ottawa when she married Angus MacInnis in 1932, the year the CCF party was formed. In the following years she worked and campaigned across the country and for five years was secretary of the CCF caucus at Ottawa. Mrs. MacInnis was CCF member of the British Columbia legislature for Vancouver-Burrard from 1941 to 1945 and in 1946 was one of six Canadian delegates to the international assembly of women convened in New York state by a committee headed by Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt. She and her husband, who is CCF member of Parliament for Vancouver-Kingsway, spend much of their time at Ottawa, but make their home in Vancouver.
