Wallace Bruce White and Gerald Dennis Clough have successfully completed the final examinations leading to a certificate of a Chartered Accountant in the recent uniform examinations of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants.

This announcement was made yesterday by the Prince Edward Island Institute of Chartered Accountants.

Music Seminar Is Concluded

An Invitational Seminar "Music Education in the Atlantic Provinces Present and Future" which was sponsored by the Charlottetown Festival and the Fathers of Confederation Building Trust, ended two days of sessions Tuesday at the Confederation Centre.

Topics of the four main sessions were "A common course of study—methods and materials"; "Teacher Training—centralized or regional workshops— incentives—government aid"; "A Listening program—live and recorded—radio and television" and "Pupil performances—festivals—radio and television".

All sessions were under the chairmanship of Dr. G. Roy Fenwick, former director of music in the Ontario school system and noted authority on music education.

Delegates to the seminar attended two performances in the Confederation Centre Theatre, while in the city.

Discontent Is Reported From Cuba

WASHINGTON (AP)—A top U.S. state department official told Congress here: "There have been indications of growing popular dissatisfaction in Cuba and signs of disillusionment with (Premier Fidel) Castro's leadership."

Lincoln Gordon, assistant state secretary for inter-American affairs, told the Senate refugee subcommittee.

"Under continued mismanagement, the Cuban economy continues to deteriorate. This year's sugar harvest was only 60 per cent of the goal and agricultural production in general remains low. Food rationing is increasingly severe."

In an apparent reference to China, Gordon said Castro's "violent attacks against certain of his Communist friends have tended to isolate Cuba even within the Communist world." Gordon gave his assessment of the situation in testifying in support of a bill to permit adjustment of the status of Cuban refugees in the United States to permanent residents.
