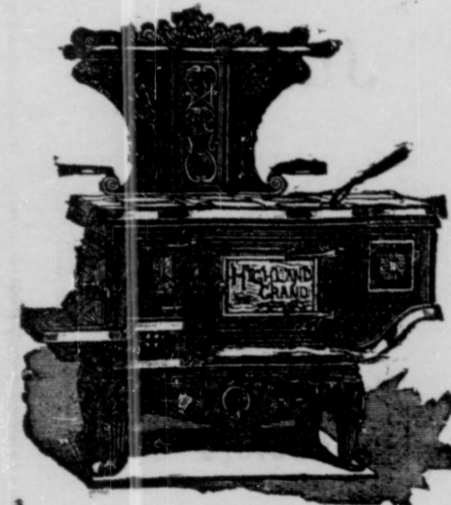

"LEST WE FORGET."

DEAR SIR:—It will be remembered that, in the summer of 1899, when the temperance people discovered that they had been deceived and humbugged by the present government on the prohibition question that temperance organizations and religious bodies of every denomination passed resolutions condemning the government in very emphatic terms for the treachery practiced upon them. The Eastern Gem Lodge, I. O. G. T., of North Lake, was among the number of temperance societies which recorded its disapproval. It will be remembered that the columns of the Patriot (?) newspaper was thrown open to anonymous writers who used them to insult and abuse the temperance people. It will be remembered that one of those writers, or a little clique of writers, began a lengthy article with the above heading, "Lest We Forget."

Will you permit me, Mr. Editor, to remind the temperance people, and the temperance voters in particular, that this is the opportune time to remind Sir Wilfrid Laurier that the temperance people of Canada cannot be insulted with impunity. The time has come for the 278,487 voters who voted for prohibition to show Sir Wilfrid who is master.

Temperance electors, don't forget that every vote cast for Hughes, McKinnon, Davies, Bell or McLellan is a nail in prohibition's coffin, and the rolling back of the tide of temperance influence for more than half a century. Let the temperance people of this Dominion present a solid front to the enemy, and teach Tarte, Laurier & Co. that the people must rule; that the mandate of the people must be obeyed. Let me remind the temperance electors that the leaders of the present Government are in league with the "rum party" of Quebec and using their influence to further their interest, working tooth and nail against the temperance people.

Let me remind temperance societies that now is the time to do all in their power to further the interests of the temperance cause. One ballot marked for the opposition candidate will be worth more to the cause of temperance than all the resolutions passed in 1899.

Let us remind Tarte, Laurier & Co. that the temperance people are not all fanatics, and that the temperance cause is dearer to their heart than the retaining in power of a corrupt, extravagant and incapable government.
