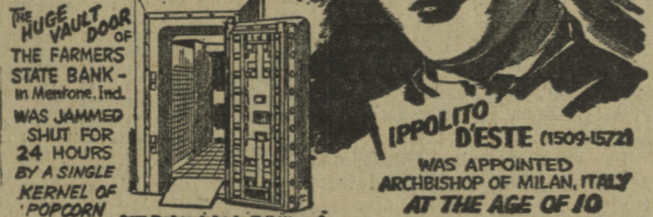

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:
East South West North
1 ♠ Pass 1 ♠ Pass
2 ♠ Pass 2 ♠ Pass
3 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ Pass
4 ♠ Pass 4 ♠ Pass

Which card do you choose as your opening lead in each of the following four hands?
1. ♠ J10 85 ♥ K4 ♠ 10 42 ♣ KJ73
2. ♠ J73 ♥ K5 ♠ A63 ♣ J8654
3. ♠ 8532 ♥ QJ73 ♠ 85 ♣ Q982
4. ♠ 10 ♥ 10 982 ♠ K52 ♣ QJ10 75

1. Two of diamonds. The blind lead, partner never having bid, frequently presents a difficult choice of plays, and this hand is typical of the uncertainties of the opening lead.
The trump lead is recommended because there is a good chance, on the bidding, that dummy has distributional values and is short-suited (probably in clubs). Repeated trump leads may therefore cut some of dummy's ruffing power. Any other lead is inherently dangerous and may result in the loss of a vital trick.

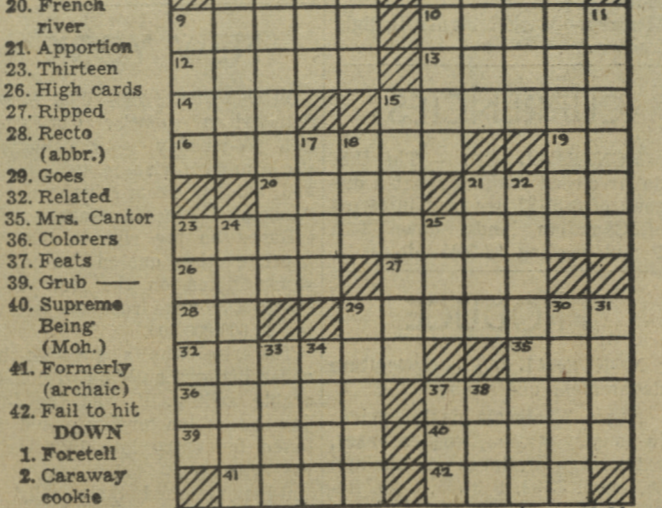
CHARLIE'S FLING OVER

LONDON (AP)— Charlie the homiesick horse was home and safely corralled Sunday night, trapped by a farmer's cunning and a herd of bullocks.
The ruse foiled Charlie's attempt to hoof it back 300 miles westward to his native Wales.
'You don't know how relieved I am to have him back,' said his owner, Mrs. Anne Tomkin. 'Charlie is six now and really old enough to know better.'
Charlie set out from the Dunmow, Essex, f. m. of the Tomkins more than a week ago, with the apparent intention of fording rivers, crossing railroads and dodging police until he ended up in the Welsh county of Cardiganshire where he was born.
A farmer at Baldock, in Hertfordshire, sighted Charlie at that town 50 miles due west from Dunmow. He thought nothing of it until he saw the missing Charlie stories in the newspapers.
He called the village policeman. They figured Charlie must be hungry, so they drove the bullocks down to the cattle yard to eat.
'Charlie, being sweet natured and very hungry, followed and was duly rounded up,' Mrs. Tomkin said. 'They shipped him home Saturday.'
