(Continued from Page 1) the winds changed to north northwest at 22 mph and gusts to 35. Light snow and blowing snow was the prospect for this morning with temperatures hovering around the 14-degree mark.

TRAIN DELAYED

The CNR ferry Abegweit was nearly on schedule, but the Borden trains to Charlotte and Summerside were delayed about two hours when a transport truck became stuck on the tracks at the Borden wharf. A snowplow was finally brought in to remove the truck.

The tanker, J. Edouard Simard, docked at Charlottetown yesterday afternoon after battling ice and zero visibility all day.

Schools across the Island closed yesterday afternoon and all bus transport came to a halt. Mail delivery was held up in several districts as postmen found even walking difficult.

A plow was called to open the road from Leoville in the afternoon to take a sick child to a doctor in Tinian. Another plow opened the road from the Dock to Alberton to allow a taxi to be taken to the Western Hospital.

Although roads near Montague were next to impassable the town itself remained fairly clear and the plow began its rounds at 4 p.m.

RIOTS EASE IN CALCUTTA

CALCUTTA, India (AP) — Hindu-Muslim violence subsided Tuesday after five days which brought death to 150 persons in Calcutta and nearby areas.

The daytime curfew is to be lifted from today in riot-stricken areas to permit employees to travel to work. But army patrols were extended to prevent further outbreaks.

West Bengal's chief minister P. C. Sen announced that 100 persons were killed in riots and 51 by police or army firing since the trouble started last Thursday. He said 624 were injured. These figures are for the city and nearby districts.

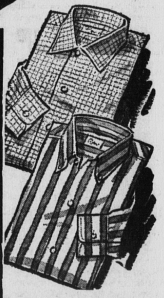
