Roger Caron knows about Canada's penal system—and he knows about crime. He was sixteen when first convicted for breaking and entering. Over a period of twenty-four years he spent time in every major prison across the country, from Stoney Mountain in Manitoba, to Dorchester in New Brunswick. He was dubbed 'Mad Dog Caron' by the press for his record number of escape attempts—

thirteen in all!

Caron's autobiography Go-Boy! was published in 1978 and won the Governor General's Award for non-fiction. For Caron, the completion of his book meant the discovery of dignity and self-worth, as writing replaced crime as his career. Caron talks without self pity—from an insider's point of view.
