PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Yukon Bill Killed by the Senate.

BY A VOTE OF 52 TO 14.

Davis Points to the Government's Bad Faith With Our Farmers.

OTTAWA, March 31.—The Senate by a vote of 52 to 14 threw out the Yukon bill last night.

The Minister of Justice spoke at length in defence of the bill.

Senator O'Donoghue said that, though a Liberal, he could not support the Government in this measure which he boldly declared to be one of the biggest steals ever perpetrated in the history of the country.

Senator Macdonald, of P. E. Island, protested against the alienation of the mining lands and the oppression involved to the miners. He could not see how any reasonable man could support the compact.

The only Conservative Senator who voted with the Government was Senator Dobson, who, like Colonel Hughes, is of the same locality as the contractor McKenzie and like Colonel Hughes voted with the Government.

Senator O'Donoghue (Liberal) voted against the bill as did Senators Boulton and Bellrose who sometimes voted with the Liberals.

Senator Frank Smith was paired in favor of the bill. All the other Conservatives whom the contractors counted in their favor voted against the bill.

OTTAWA, March 31.—In the House of Commons Mr. Davin proposed his motion "That good faith on the part of the present government with the farmers of the North West should compel them to place agricultural improvements on the free list."

In an able speech, Mr. Davin showed that the government was pledged to free farm machinery. His speech was full of clever epigram and sarcasm in which he presented the sharp contrast between grit promise and grit performance.

In the evening the House sat through a docket of private bills and some public orders and adjourned early.

A BRITISH CRUISER MISSING.

Considerable Anxiety Regarding Her.

LONDON, March 31.—Anxiety is beginning to be felt regarding the safety of the British cruiser Rapid which sailed for England from Gibraltar on March 9th. She has not been heard from since sailing.

UNITED STATES AND SPAIN.

The Crisis is Now Imminent.

Spanish Preparations for a Fight.

WASHINGTON, March 31.—On the answer to the proposition made by the government probably depends the future course of the relations between Spain and the United States.

It is believed that it is now a question of an exceedingly short time before the crisis must come.

MADRID, March 31.—The Pais says that orders have been issued to mobilize all the Spanish warships, and that a second torpedo squadron is being prepared for sea at Cadiz.

The Balcaric stands are being fortified and military engineers are starting for the Canary Islands.

NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

HALIFAX, March 28.—It is estimated that Nova Scotians have \$2,000,000 invested in securities on the New York stock exchange, and as the average decline of these is about ten per cent. since the Spanish-American war scare, this means that the people are from 200,000 to a quarter of a million dollars poorer than before the war was talked of.

LONDON, March 28.—The numerous railroad mysteries (there have been five of them since last Sunday) have called forth a renewed outcry against the dangers of compartment carriages, and demands that legislation compel the railroads to adopt corridor cars. The dead bodies of three male passengers have been found this week on railroad trains under circumstances pointing to foul play.

BERLIN, March 28.—The correspondent of the Berliner Tagblatt telegraphs: "The Marquis Visconti Venosti, the Italian foreign minister says the Cuban situation has grown worse, but that outside of Austria, which morally supports Spain, for dynasty reasons, no European power is inclined to show practical sympathy for Spain. Ricotti Garibaldi says that if the United States will defray their expenses, he will engage to send 40,000 Garibaldians to Cuba."

MONTREAL, March 28.—La Patrie discusses William Redmond's proposition for a coalition between France and Ireland as follows:—"We believe it to be our duty to put the newspapers in France on their guard against the Irish element and its tendencies, especially in the United States. The Irish in their clergy, as well as in their politics, are the worst enemies of our beautiful French language and our national influence to the American republic, and it is probably the same elsewhere."

SPANISH OPINION.

Will not Prevent Interference in the Guise of Philanthropy.

MADRID, March 29.—The semi-official El Liberal says: "The report on the Maine contains no grave statements. Therefore President McKinley will not use that pretext for declaring war, but will use the relief of the Cubans."

El Liberal adds: "We believe the Spanish government will never tolerate a foreign nation, in the guise of philanthropy, invading our territory, for it would be followed by the unanimous protest of the Spanish people."

The same paper then commends Spain to prepare to repel every kind of intervention, to be unflinchingly firm, and to accept nothing affecting the dignity and sovereignty of Spain.

The Imparcial (independent) says it "notes a change of attitude upon the part of the United States," expresses the belief that "when the six Spanish cruisers and torpedo boats arrive in Havana the relations between the two countries will improve." It hopes the Spanish government will "act on these lines."
