Federal Surplus Climbs; Defence Spending Lags

OTTAWA, Aug. 30 - (CP) - The Federal Government's 1952-53 budgetary surplus climbed to \$334,916,000 in the first four months of the fiscal year. A surplus of only \$9,000,000 for the year was forecast by Finance Minister Abbott. In his budget speech April 8, Mr. Abbott estimated the year's revenues at \$4,279,000,000 and expenditures at \$4,270,000,000. The financial year ends next March 31. A monthly Treasury report, issued today, said that expenditures, particularly defence expenditures, have been lower than estimated. In the period, defence and defence production expenditures totalled \$439,653,000 compared with \$293,544,000 in the comparative four-month period of 1951-52. Parliament authorized defence expenditures of \$2,100,000,000 in the year. In 1951-52, Mr. Abbott budgeted for a surplus of \$30,000,000 and ended with one of \$240,000,000.
