## THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

**UTILITARIANISM OUSTS GOD FROM HUMAN MINDS**  
The rapid evolution of modern methods of communication, leading to the notion of "One World," gives an importance greater than ever to the ability and the desire of men to deal with each other honestly and truthfully. Today, the lie and half-truth effect greater evil because they are no longer limited to small segments of society.  
Peoples and nations are today so closely connected — for good or for evil — that the lie, especially the political lie, leaves few untouched by its malice. Hence, we shall not waste our time in a brief consideration of the attitude of modern society, not only toward lying, but toward sin in general. A lie is opposed to truth. Truth is present when the external manifestation by word, action or sign, conforms with the idea. Truth is lacking when conformity between the thing and reality is lacking. When sign used (words or actions) does not conform to the thing signified or what one has in his mind, that sign is a lie. A person lies when he intends to deceive, when he says what he knows is false.  
Now, what makes a lie evil? In what does its malice consist? Here we must get down to fundamental principles and realize that whatever is opposed to nature and is used for a purpose other than that intended by the creator of nature, is a deordination, hence evil.  
Concerning lying, we must understand that man has been en-

dowed with reason and with the means of making known to others his thoughts and feelings. This ability to manifest our ideas to others is a great gift: it is a natural complement of reason, man's highest faculty.  
**SPEECH ABUSED**  
The most common way of conveying ideas to others is through speech. When speech does not conform with the idea, man is not using it according to its nature. He is abusing a God-given faculty by using it for a purpose other than that intended by the Creator and for something which it is not ordained. Hence to use this marvelous faculty to speak for any purpose than to express what is in the mind is a deordination and therefore sinful.  
Present-day moral philosophers, imbued with false notions, have eliminated God and think only of themselves in determining what is right and wrong. The modern principles of morality may be summarized by the question: "What good will we get out of it?"  
This condition of society has resulted possibly from the utilitarian philosophies of such men as Hume, Mill, Spencer and others. "Conduct, like anything else, should be called good or bad as it is well adapted or mal-adapted to the ends of life. The highest conduct is that which conduces to the greatest length, breadth and temporalities of life" (Herbert Spencer). In his Story of Philosophy, Will Durant writes, "Men accept of reject philosophies according to their needs and temperaments, not according to objective truth." We all know the cynical use that Voltaire made of the great lie, and how the same cynical use by Hitler still leaves the world shattered and torn by strife.  
If we were, however, to ask such philosophers as Spencer to defend their position, we would get the following answer: Lying is wrong, not intrinsically (i.e. always) but because it is not useful to society. Society is made up of a group of individuals and in order that they live peacefully together, it is necessary to tell the truth. Sometimes, however, telling a lie may be useful to society or the individual; if it would seem there would be no circumstances in telling it under such

The only evil for modern philosophers is what does not prove useful to man or that group of men in which they are alone are interested; and this is what produces a Hitler and his life.  
It is true, nevertheless, that society is much interested in sincerity. Social intercourse is hindered by lying. The Catholic Church is not unmindful of the welfare of society. She insists upon a special duty of charity toward our neighbor.  
But the common good of society is not the sole end of man. Man is bound to seek God as his last end. The only basis of morality is God, the Holy and Just Law-giver, who has revealed His law to man. It is because the above utilitarian morality pervades the world, that God has been cast out of men's minds and conduct.  
Morality that is based on half-truths and severed from God must wither and die like the branch cut from the trunk. Just as a branch which is grafted again to the life-saving sap of the tree, so modern state of health through the life-giving sap of the fundamental principles of truth taught by Christ who said of Himself, "I am the way the Truth and the Life."
