

# Special Senate Meeting Turns Into Backbiting Session

The U.P.E.I. Senate held a special meeting last Thursday afternoon for the purpose of discussing the status of the Education Faculty. The P.E.I. Teacher's Federation was represented at the meeting for the purpose of giving their views on this matter stating that "to remove the faculty status would be disastrous because it would reduce the professional status of teachers and education on the Island".

The organization bore quite heavily down upon the image of education stating that it

felt to 'demote' Education from a Faculty to a department would "only lead teachers to believe that the university is not carry out its responsibilities". Their other major point was that faculty status would make it easier to find qualified people to work in Education, saying "high calibre people are less likely to want to serve under a Dean of Arts than to have the freedom to develop their own programs".

After some rather pointless circumlocution, Gary Webster

attempted to provide the major elements of the arguments for the other side. To summarize his arguments he stated that faculty status would make Education "more isolated from the mainstream of the university, more open to pressures from the Provincial Government, from the profession, and from the Boards of Education" and that it would be able to get a larger budget under the Arts Faculty... "Arts has a big budget".

Subsequent to this little real argument was presented

with the meeting all too often degenerating into backbiting. The only subsequent point of any interest at all that was made came in the rather startling comment of one member of the P.E.I.T.F. that "We should be on this Senate...if anyone has an interest in what happens here, it's us; after all we provide your raw material".

After two hours of hassles, the meeting broke up without having made any decisions. This was the second Senate meeting to deal with this topic.

the University of Prince Edward Island Student Union and the members of the University of Prince Edward Island Student Union Photo Club for the time period of November 15, 1975 to September 1, 1976 April 30, 1976

The Student Union shall:

1. Repair all existing equipment on the premises of the Photo Club; that equipment being the property of the Student Union.

2. Supply the Photo Club with the necessary materials to produce pictures for the following:

- a. Yearbook
- b. Movie Club
- c. Cadre
- d. Students Council

e. Photo Club members (as long as the pictures are not being sold)

3. Supply sufficient equipment necessary to teach new members of the Photo Club as to the workings of basic photography. (The purchase of the afore-stated equipment will be at the discretion of the Student Union Treasurer who will consult the Student Council when necessary).

The Photo Club Members Shall:

1. Be responsible in obtaining all members of the Club.

2. Be responsible for calling all meetings of the Club.

3. Be responsible for obtaining purchase orders for all purchases made through the Student Union.

4. Be responsible for turning all invoices in to the Student Union offices for payment.

5. Be responsible for supplying all necessary black and white photos to the following given reasonable notice at no labor cost to the Students Union.

- a. Yearbook, limited color photos
- b. Movie Club
- c. Cadre
- d. Students Council (this includes all photos for any

Students Council elections; there will be a limit of 20 (10) per person. Any other photos for Students Council shall be negotiated with the Photo Club as to amounts of prints, (on condition that the Students Council get the club a stabilizer)

6. Be responsible for covering all homegames and social events Be responsible for covering one event of each type.

7. Be responsible for recording and asking permission on all long distance telephone calls.

8. Be responsible for receiving permission from the

executive for all trips made by the Photo Club where the Student Union is responsible for the costs.

9. Be responsible for an up-to-date inventory of materials and equipment of the Photo Club.

10. Be responsible for the upkeep of all equipment in the Photo Club at the cost of the Student Union.

11. Be responsible for all pertinent correspondence which will be typed up by the Student Union secretary who will also file and mail this correspondence.
