Only one third of Canada has been settled or developed. Eight per cent of the area now is farmed and another eight per cent is suitable for farming.

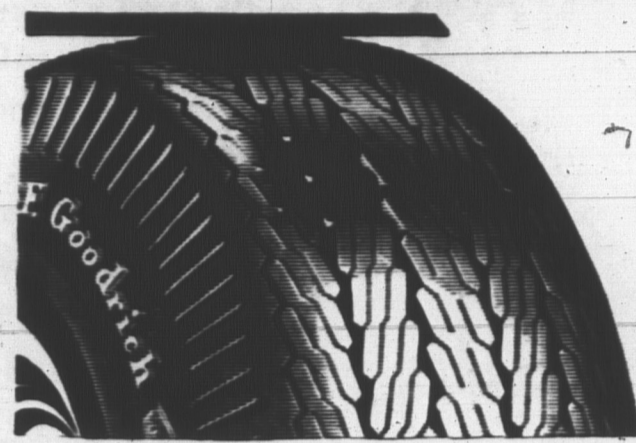
