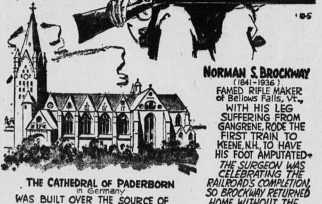

Still faced with two club losers, General Frumher crossed to dummy with a trump and led the nine of spades, discarding club West took the trick, but was then in the unhappy position where he was forced to return a club to the queen or else yield a ruff and discard.

He had a club hiving to find East with the queen, but his hope did not materialize and the outcome was that South made six diamonds doubled.

Probably West should not have doubled. He should have realized that it would be difficult to beat a general at the old army game!
