

# Canadian Bishops Warn Of Pitfalls

VATICAN CITY (CP) — A warning against pitfalls in programs through which rich countries join to aid underdeveloped countries has been sounded by Canadian bishops at the Vatican ecumenical council.

"This collaboration is one of the greatest signs of divine influence in our times," he said in a written submission on a section of the document dealing with the church in the modern world.

Risk "These praiseworthy and much-needed programs run the best of becoming deformed. These vast undertakings can become new forms of power and domination. The gifts of nations may be misused to strengthen the influence of the donors rather than to promote the welfare of the less privileged."

Debate closed on this section of the document before the views of a number of Canadian bishops could be presented orally. Their opinions were submitted in writing.

**WEIGH CAREFULLY**  
Under council rules, written views are weighed as carefully as oral ones in the redrafting of texts.

The section on which the Canadian delegates put forward their views deals with the world's cultural, social and economic problems. The draft text on these matters is a general review of the encyclical of Pope John Mater et Magistra ("Mother and Teacher" in Latin). # REBEL STEER PROVES TOUGH

HALIFAX (CP) — A blast from a shotgun carried by a passing motorist brought down a rebellious steer in the city's north end after a policeman shot it three times in the head with borrowed .303-calibre rifle.

On its way to slaughter at the city abattoir, the animal broke away from owner Nelson Gage of nearby Chezzetcook and pounded through mid-morning traffic on Windsor Street before being corralled in a yard by a truck driver across the entrance.

A resident offered the policeman a 300 rifle and ammunition after efforts to lasso the animal and coax it from the yard failed.

Hit three times in the head by the rifle bullets, it ran into a cemetery. The steer returned to Windsor Street where the motorist, who happened to have a shotgun and ammunition in his car, felled it.

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# Gov.-General Stresses Value Of Competent Civic Service

OTTAWA (CP) — Governor-General Vanier said in a rare and courageous civil servant's refusal to take a new look at the country's institutions.

The governor-general, who presented the Vanier Medal of the Canadian Institute of Public Administration to former Ontario revenue commissioner Philip T. Clark, told a group of high-ranking federal and provincial civil servants attending the ceremony:

"It is obvious that a well-organized and competent civil service is essential to the good order of the government of a civilized state, especially in the case of democracy."

"A necessity at all times, this need becomes of prime importance whenever it becomes a matter of making decisions which will have permanent consequences."

**PRIZED FOR STABILITY**  
While setting out qualifications for the ideal civil servant, Gen. Vanier praised Canada's present federal, provincial and municipal civil servants for their stability and sense of national unity.

"Canada has always been very fortunate in having among all her officials, of whatever branch of government, a real sense of unity."

"They have always had the excellent good sense to know and understand that in the last analysis they all belong to one, big public service."

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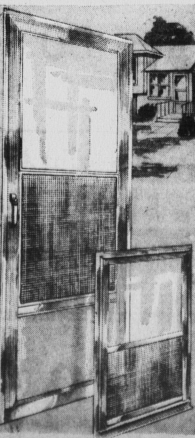
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
