## Toronto Firm To Study West Pt. Ferry Data

The Toronto firm of Stevenson and Kellogg, after discussions yesterday with the West Point Ferry committee and Industry and Natural Resources Minister Leo Rossiter, will study data gathered and submit a price on the cost of a feasibility study on the proposed West Point - New Brunswick ferry service.

Representatives of the company met yesterday with Mr. Rossiter and the ferry committee in Charlottetown.

"If a survey can be arranged," said Mr. Rossiter, "it will

probably qualify under the provisions of the federal-provincial Agricultural Rehabilitation and Development Act. If so, the federal government will pay 50 per cent of the cost."

The minister indicated that considerable information regarding a ferry service will be available to the Toronto firm. "Much data," he said, "has already been gathered by the department of industry and natural resources, the department of tourism, and the federal departments of transport and public works."

## Renewal Of Arms Conference Is Urged By E.L.M. Burns

GENEVA — Canadian delegate E. L. M. Burns appealed to the nuclear powers Wednesday to return to the disarmament conference after the Christmas recess with instructions that would permit the conclusion of a nuclear test-ban treaty early in the New Year.

Burns expressed disappointment over the rejection of an interim arrangement to halt underground tests.

Such a time-limited arrangement was proposed by most of the neutral delegations in order to enable all tests to be stopped by the end of this year, while permitting the three nuclear powers to continue negotiating a final agreement.

Burns said he was unable to understand the objections of the

Soviet delegate, who had said an interim arrangement would open to the Western powers the possibility of carrying out underground tests.

## SAYS CHARGE CURIOUS

"Surely this is a curious charge to make against a suggestion which has had the support of the majority of members of the United Nations as well as the majority of those around this table," Burns said.

"Under such an arrangement the Soviet Union would have the opportunity of demonstrating to the interim scientific commission that it is right when it claims that on-site inspection is unnecessary."
