Meef Daughter Through Aid Of Red Cross

On Sunday morning at Dorval Airport, a long visit ended for Mr. and Mrs. Leslie G. Gardos, 8108 Arcadian Road, Montreal, when their eight-year-old daughter, Eva Susanne, was reunited with them after painful years of separation. The parents remembered their little girl as a three-month-old infant in faraway Budapest.

Through the intervention of the Canadian Red Cross Society with its sister society in Hungary, Eva was at long last granted a Hungarian passport and exit visa a few days ago. She travelled alone from Budapest via Prague, Amsterdam, and London and was met by Red Cross representatives en route. Red Cross officials were at the airport to meet her as she stepped down from a TCA Super-Constellation.

Eva is one of several hundred children from eastern Europe restored to their parents in Canada through Red Cross intervention. Until recently the majority were Greek Nationals, separated from their parents during the civil disturbances of 1947 and 1948 in Macedonia. During the past few months the Canadian Red Cross Society has been successful in negotiating the release of children of other nationalities as well.

Mr. and Mrs. Gardos were both born in Hungary where they resided until 1949. After a short residence in France they emigrated to Canada in 1951. Mr. Gardos is an accountant by profession and is presently employed by an electrical firm in Montreal. He intends to become a Canadian citizen as soon as his required period of residence in this city has been completed.

Eva Gardos is the second Hungarian youngster to come to Canada through the Canadian Red Cross project. Two weeks ago Catherine Christof, 4129 Westerg Avenue, Montreal, was reunited with her parents Mr. and Mrs. George Christof.
