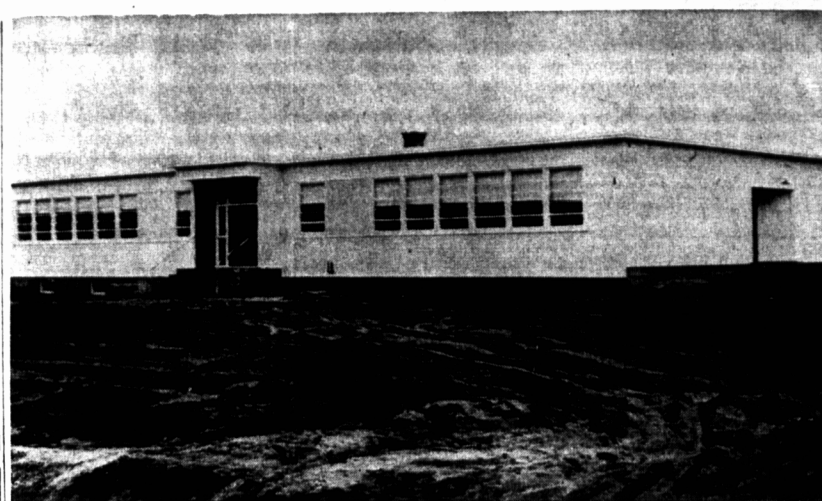


# MORELL HIGH SCHOOL OPENS TODAY

THE OPENING OF THE

 Architect, Charlottetown



On March 12, 1956, a meeting of the rate payers was held to discuss the subject of building a High School. Grade XI had been opened the September previous, and in order to complete the Senior High School course it would be necessary to open Grade XII. Then, too, the increased enrollment in the lower grades made it necessary to add another classroom to the grade school. In view of these facts, it was decided to build a new High School.

The trustees, Messrs. Gordon Coffin, Carl McAdam, and Sidney Anderson were authorized to proceed with the necessary arrangements. A building committee composed of Rev. Eric Robin, Percy Robbins, Louis McGuire, and Frank Dunn was appointed to assist the trustees. At the annual meeting the necessary money was voted and William Aylward was elected as school trustee.

A suitable site was secured from Mrs. Marion Anderson consisting of 2 1/2 acres. With the assistance of government machinery, under the direction of Mr. Harold Webster, the people turned out and cleared the site. The plans were drawn up by Mr. Keith Pickard, and work commenced the first week of July under the capable direction of Mr. William Aylward with local help.

On September 6th seventy students were enrolled in Grades

At eight o'clock this evening the formal opening of the new Morell High School takes place. The Hon. Keir Clark, Minister of Education, officiates at the cutting of the ribbon, and declares the school officially open. He will be assisted in cutting the ribbon by Mr. Gordon Coffin, chairman of school trustees. Miss Mabel O'Brien, principal of the school, and Mr. Donald McDon-

ald, president of the Students' Union. The preliminary proceedings will take place in the Morell Community Hall. The guest speaker will be Dr. Lloyd Shaw, deputy minister of Education. Greetings will be extended by Mr. James B. Jay, speaking for the village commissioners, and also by Mr. Chester Pratt, speaking for the districts served by the

High School. Rev. Mr. McLean, Mt. Stewart and Rev. Eric Robin, will speak on behalf of the neighboring clergy. Mr. Malcolm McKenzie, supervisor of High Schools, and Mr. Harold Hynes, school inspector, will also address the meeting. This part of the program will conclude with the presentation of the keys to the school by the architect, Mr. Keith Pickard.
