NOT ORDINARY EPITAPHS.

Of the writing of epitaphs, like books, there is no end. Some are really humorous, at least as much as possible in dealing with so grave a subject, while others bear evidence of being intensely apocryphal. The following, presumably gleaned from a Missouri headstone, is rather biased:

"Hictacet Sarah Ann, whose breath gave out 10th June, 1780." It was a short way of saying:

Beneath this silent stone is laid
A noisy antiquated jade,
Who from her cradle talked till death.

And ne'er before was out of breath.
This man who preferred "tacet" to "jacet" obviously knew what he was talking about, but the German after Hans Breitman's own heart who penned the following, to be inscribed on the tombstone of his wife, obviously did not:

"Mine wife Susan is dead; if she has life till next Friday she would haf bin dead shust two weeks. As a tree fall so must it stan; all tings ish impossible mit God.

Instances where some leading characteristic of feature is set forward as if it were a virtue are frequently met with. A South Carolina epitaph illustrates this:

Here lies the body of Robert Gordin,
Mouth almighty and teeth accord-

in.
Stranger, tread lightly over this sod!
If he opens his mouth you are gone,
By—thunder.

The grasping avarice of the miser is almost toned down to a pleasant recollection in the following:

Here lies the old Jemmy Snaps, who ne'er cried "jam satis,"
'Twould wake him if he knew that you read his tombstone gratis.

It is not often that a man's name helps out the the exigencies of rhyme in describing his leading virtue, and this makes the following from Concord somewhat remarkable:

Here lies John Auricular,
Who in the way of the Lord walked perpendicular.

The same feat of achieving the perpendicular was ascribed to General Wolfe. At his death a prize was offered for the best eptaph on the great man, and one candidate sent in the following:

He marched without dread or fears
At the head of his bold grenadiers,
And what was more remarkable—nay,
Very particular,
He climbed up rocks that were perpendicular.

Every one knows that it is an exceedingly simple matter to climb up rocks that are perpendicular. What General Wolfe had to be thankful for was, that he was not asked to climb up his tall epitaph. The poet did not get the prize. This was the epitaph that Wolfe would sooner not have writ-

ten than have taken Quebec. It is fortunate that.

BREAK-UP OF CHINA.

The most important by far of all speculations concerning China is what the Powers will do with Chinese territory. A story has gone abroad that Russia has informed the United States Government that she purposes to annex Manchuria. Whether any such declaration has been made to any power not much doubt need be felt, however, that it merely embodies Russia's intentions, subject only to her ability to meet the opposition which the annexation of Manchuria would be sure to encounter from Japan. In fact, the process has already begun, since Russia is quietly assimilating Chinese territory south of the Amur river. In some quarters it is thought that the landing of Japanese troops at Amoy is the Japanese answer to these Muscovite moves. The British Consul at Shanghai has been appealed to by the Viceroy of Fuhkien to prevent this aggression. The Tokio Government may possibly reply to any protest by alleging that if the integrity of China is violated by Russia on the north Japan is also entitled to seek territorial acquisitions in the Celestial kingdom.

Some outspoken critics here are beginning to recognize that the outcome of the present crisis will eventually be that slices of Chinese territory will certainly pass into the possession of Russia, Germany and Japan. The first named will seize the Province of Manchuria on the plea that China declared war and invaded Siberia.

Germany will claim Shantung as indemnity for the murder of Baron Von Ketteler and Japan will take Corea, if she can get it, or if not, Amoy. What
