As he turned to cross to his car standing at the pavement—"Where are you making for?" He asked Robin.

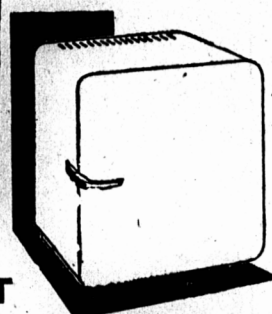
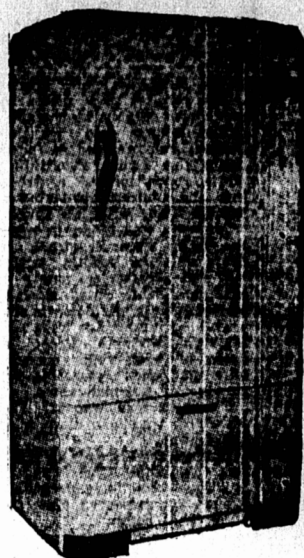
"I'm on my way to Scotland Yard."

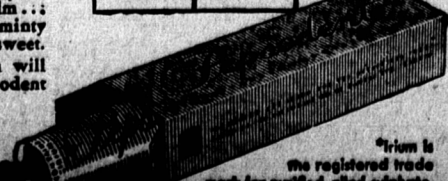
