

Court Cleared In Preliminary Murder Hearing

VICTORIA (CP)—The preliminary hearing of a murder charge against Victoria tugboatman Leo Mantha will be closed to the press and public.

The order was made Monday by Magistrate Henry Hall as the preliminary hearing opened in suburban Esquimalt police court. Request that the hearing be closed was made by Crown counsel W.R. McIntyre.

Mantha is accused of stabbing to death AB Aaron H. Jenkins, 23, of Codys, N.B., in a barracks at HMCS Naden Sept. 6.

Mr. McIntyre said the "interests of justice could not be adequately served" if the hearing were held in public.

"Why" asked the magistrate. The prosecutor said if he were to expand on his statement while the public was present it would defeat the purpose of his application.

The court was cleared while Mr. McIntyre explained to the court the reason behind the application. Defence counsel Alan MacFarlane agreed with the move.

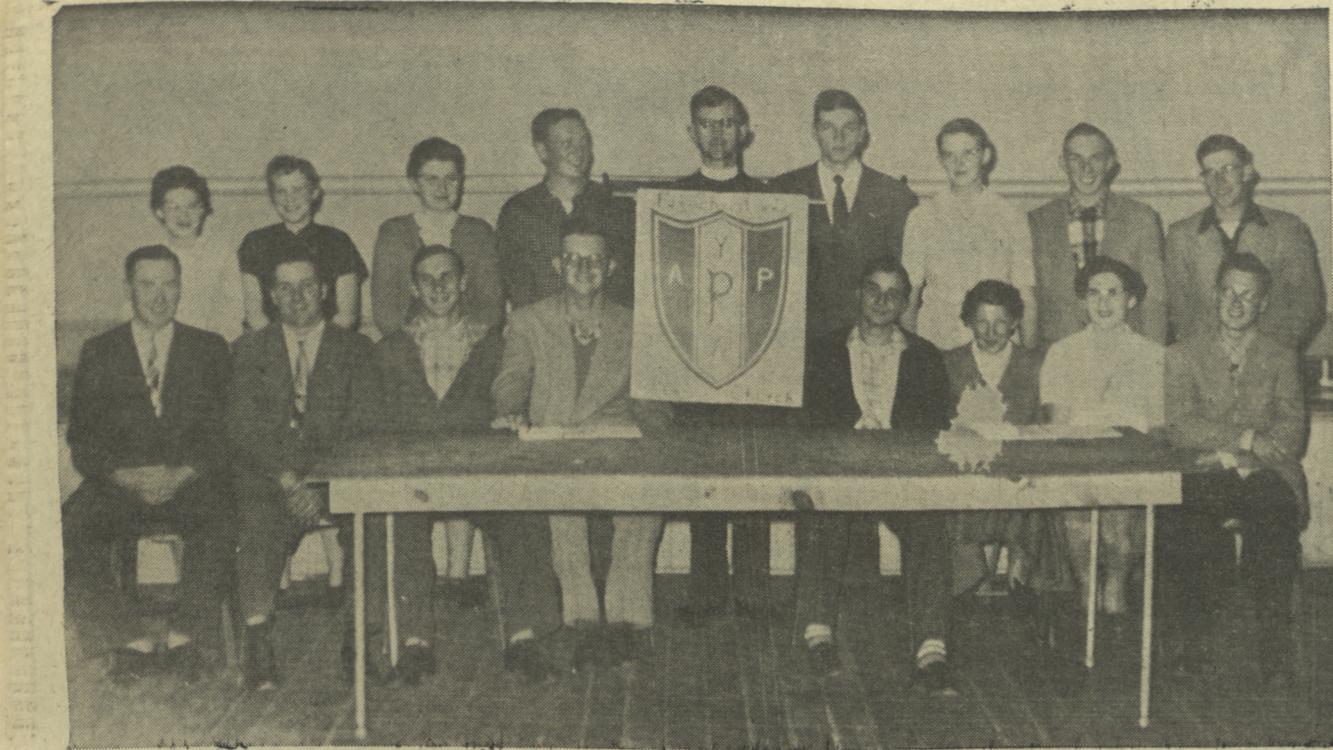
