**Gas Theft Case In City Court**  
 Three Charlottetown youths, two aged 17 and the other 18, were arraigned in City Police Court on Saturday charged with theft of a quantity of gasoline.  
 The three pleaded guilty to taking gas from a car parked in front of the Swifts company on Belmont St. early Saturday morning.  
 Magistrate K. M. Martin remanded the case until Tuesday April 2 for sentence.

A 21-year-old city boy was fined \$100 and costs when he pleaded guilty to a charge of impaired driving.  
 Three other men were charged with being drunk and incapable. An Orlebar street man, who at the time of his arrest on Friday was out of jail appealing a previous sentence, was fined \$50 and costs or an additional 30 days.  
 An Orwell Cove resident was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days for being drunk and incapable and a 40-year-old Pownal street man was remanded one week or a similar charge.
