# Blind Woodsman Uses Power Saw

**HECLA ISLAND, Man. (CP)**—The whoop of a power saw cut through the woods in the dark of night attracts little attention on his last night 15 miles north of Winnipeg.  
 Residents know it is "the blind woodsman" of Hecla Island.  
 Cutting trees at night with a power saw is not one of the activities of Edward Torfason, a 67-year-old former fisherman who lost his sight 13 years ago in an accident with a barbed wire.  
 He also is adept at hauling, cutting grass and carrying water from ice holes.  
 His neighbors call him "the blind woodsman" and his wife calls him wonderful.  
 George Gillis, field secretary with the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, says Mr. Torfason gets to the bush by following the shoulder of a highway that skirts the mountainside.  
 At a marker, he leaves the highway and enters the woods along a guide line he has erected.  
 Before seeking out suitable trees, he places a transistor radio at the end of the guide line. The sound tells him where he is at all times.  
 "His greatest achievement is lining up the tractor which he uses to tow a circular saw," says Mr. Gillis.  
 Mr. Torfason has installed a chimney and septic tank for the couple's 60-year-old house and made new door and window frames for the building.  
 The house and 240 acres of property or hauls water from a hole in the ice, he takes safe-guards to prevent accidents by setting up a sound beacon at the front and rear of his home.

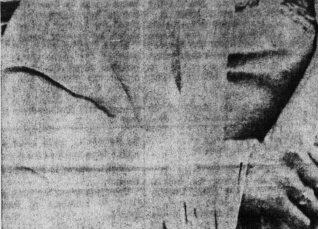
**ADRIAN D. FEEHAN** inserted by the family.

# Automation Age Problems Seen Slighter in Canada

**MONTREAL (CP)**—Gilles Beausoleil, director of the University of Montreal's industrial relations centre, says "no industrial effort" is being expended in Canada on problems arising out of automation.  
 He told a two-day symposium on automation that some serious research is being done but there is insufficient knowledge of the consequences of automation. Research was dispersed among several groups, including government, industry and labour.  
 "Technological progress is an essential factor in economic development, in the improvement of revenues and in the dynamic transformation of contemporary societies," he said. "Our life and that of our children will be improved because of technological development."  
 But, he said, this technical progress could result in having "only white traces left in its wake."  
 Technological progress and its accelerated form that is automation, pose serious problems in many areas: the sharing of economic gains and compensation for losses; problems of adaptation of the labor force; problems in working conditions, and problems of employment.  
 He said it is "imperative that prices for good and services be reduced" so that society as a whole may benefit from technological development.  
 "A reduction in prices would result in more take-home pay for consumers and would increase sales, allowing industries to retain labor that would otherwise have been laid off."  
 "But technical progress is not the same in all sectors and in all industries. In fields which are rapidly automated, the unit cost can be reduced more rapidly than in the economy as a whole."  
 "If these sectors try to maintain their prices and can do so effectively, the economic effects could be serious. In such cases it is necessary that the relative prices of goods and services be reduced so that economic adjustments can be made without pain and be beneficial to society as a whole."
