

The Bones of a Mastodon.

REMAINS OF AN ANIMAL THAT MUST HAVE BEEN A THIRD LARGER THAN JUMBO.

SYRACUSE, July 18. — Yesterday workmen who are digging gravel from a pit in the town of Manlius, eight miles east of this city, for the West Shore Railroad, came upon the remains of an extinct animal. Last evening a molar, weighing about twenty-five pounds, and a piece of a tusk nearly five feet long and eight inches in diameter in the thickest part, were brought to this city. To-day other portions of the tusk and part of a skin bone were found. The remains lay about thirteen feet beneath the surface in a deposit of gravel. Search is being made for the remainder of the skeleton. Prof. Boynton, who exposed the Cardiff giant fraud, says that these are the relics of a mastodon which must have been fully fourteen feet high, and probably weighed a third more than Jumbo. The tusk he says, must have been at least eleven feet long. The animal lived in the post pleocene period of the tertiary age. Prof. Boynton is of the opinion that the remains were washed into the gravel pit where they were found. Prof. Brown, instructor in natural history at Syracuse University, thinks the bones are those of a mammoth, rather than a mastodon. The tusk, he says, indicates one of the largest skeletons that has ever been exhumed. The tooth and the tusk are in a state of excellent preservation. The tip of the tusk shows the natural color of the ivory.

Killed at Lawn Tennis.

LONDON, July 18. — The picturesque town of Bedford is in the greatest excitement over a thrilling lawn tennis tragedy. A party yesterday were playing lawn tennis near the Ship Inn at St. Cuthbert's, situated in the centre of the town. Among the players were, Mr. De Vere, a young army officer, and Miss McKay, an exceedingly pretty young lady, twenty years of age. Suddenly, and without provocation, De Vere pulled out a revolver and shot Miss McKay dead on the spot. Before he could be seized he put the revolver to his ear and blew out his own brains. Great excitement prevails, both victims being well known in society, and in both cases the only surviving parents are widows. It is believed that jealousy was the motive of the crime.

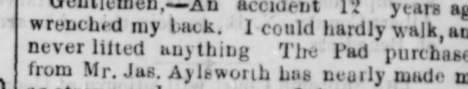

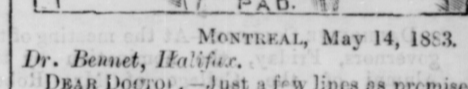
