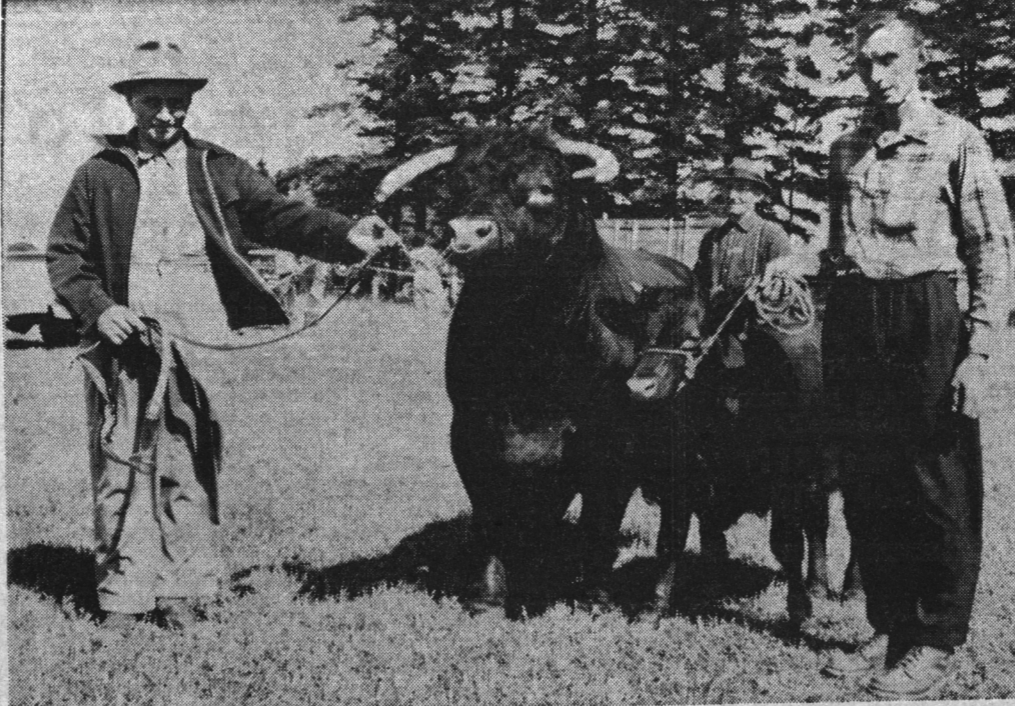

Globe And Mail Taking Over Canada Review's Functions

LONDON (CP) — Canada Weekly Review, published in London for the last five years, announced Thursday it will cease publication with its issue of Oct. 4. The newspaper, published by Roy Thomson, says "a very amicable arrangement has been worked out" with the Toronto Globe and Mail, which is to publish the first issue of its weekly overseas edition in London Oct. 7. John T. Thelwell, The Review's general manager, said the Toronto newspaper "has in effect bought the goodwill" of the Thomson publication. He did not disclose the purchase price. Under the agreement, the new weekly will acquire the circulation lists and honor unexpired subscriptions of Canada Weekly Review.
