

Death of a Successful Nova Scotian

Referring to the late John S. Blair, who was thrown from his carriage and killed in Boston last week, the Truro Sun says: He was a son of Oliver Blair, of North River, and left Truro for Boston at the age of twenty, and on reaching that city without money or means to procure a night's lodging, he sought and obtained employment as a carpenter and house-joiner, learning his business thoroughly, in all its minutest details, climbing step by step to the uppermost round of the ladder, earning a reputation all over the American Continent, as one of the most successful builders and mechanical engineers of the day, and died a millionaire, before attaining the sixtieth year of his age.

Suing a City.

The Dominion Commercial Travellers Association has decided to carry the case of Piche vs. city of Quebec to the Supreme Court of Canada. Mr. Piche, who represented a firm of hardware merchants of Montreal, while taking orders in the ancient capital was arrested on a charge of selling without license. At the suggestion of the mayor the prisoner was released on condition that he would take out a license, which is fixed at about \$69. Piche promptly paid the amount under protest and at the solicitation of friends and of the Dominion Commercial Travellers Association sued the city of Quebec for false arrest. A favorable judgment was obtained, but corporation of Quebec appealing to a higher court had the decision reversed. The association has made a deposit of \$500 to cover all expenses.

Length of the Congo.

Stanley says the length of the Congo River is 2,100 miles, and that the Mississippi and the Nile together would scarcely equal its tribute of water to the ocean. From the mouth of the river a steamer drawing fifteen feet can steam up 1,110 miles, at which point a land journey of fifty-two miles is taken on account of the rapids. Then another steaming or rowing voyage of eighty-eight miles occurs, which is succeeded by a land journey of ninety-five miles. After that it is possible to steam up another 1,060 miles. Along this route thirteen stations have been constructed among peaceable tribes.

Beecher and Spiritualism.

Mr. Beecher spoke in his sermon last Sunday about Spiritualism. "Do spirits ever revisit the earth?" he asked. "I want to say that I would be happy to believe that they did, but I have to discover it. The communications I have received purporting to be from my parents were of such a weak, milk and watery nature that they ought to have been put in an infirmary. I have been at seances perhaps a dozen times in the course of my life and have seen many things I could not understand, but nothing to convince me that communication with a spirit world is open to us."

Steamboat Expenses.

It is reported that J. X. Perrault, who has just left Ottawa, for Europe, has been entrusted by a number of Halifax and Montreal capitalists with the task of establishing a line of steamships between Halifax, Glasgow and Havre. Mr. Perrault, it is said, has succeeded in interesting the Dominion authorities and will petition the French Government for a subsidy. The line, should it be established, will run a weekly service, and in the event of its proving a success will be extended to Brazil and the River Plate.
