

entitled to recover any recompence whatever, for any damage sustained by such ship or vessel in such collision; and if any damage is sustained by any other ship or vessel, the owner of such ship or vessel infringing such rule, shall make such recompence as shall be awarded by the Court before which the case is tried.

III. In cases of collision where the damages claimed, shall not exceed twenty pounds, the same may be tried and recovered (if in the County) before any two Justices of the Peace, in the same way and manner as actions of trespass are triable; and if in Charlottetown, before the Police Court thereof, and the amount of the judgment given, may be levied by distress upon the tackle, apparel and furniture of the vessel, against which the decision shall have been given.
