

Parents of Deformed Child Want to Aid Other Victims

TORONTO (CP)—A young Toronto couple, parents of a baby deformed after the procedure of the drug thalidomide, stepped from behind a curtain of anonymity Monday to urge federal aid for other victims.

Mr. and Mrs. Glad Beaton, who believe the federal government should help parents of such children, said they would do anything to help others who have gone through what they have—or will be going through in the future.

Their open discussion of the tragedy and their consent to be named to others who have become parents of deformed babies and their belief that there should be federal aid for such parents is the reason for telling their story.

That's why we want people to know about our baby," Mrs. Beaton, 28, finds it difficult to accept the harsh fact that her first child, Kimberley, six months old, has only a trunk with rudimentary, misshapen arms and legs.

"I don't accept it. I just put it away in my mind and don't face it."

PEOPLE STARE

"I can't even take her outside anymore, everybody stares so. People look at her as if a freak instead of a baby."

She decided against placing Kim in a private nursery because "they couldn't put her away."

"I couldn't do that to my own baby. Why, the babies in the homes were dirty and had holes in their clothes. When I put Kimberley in, she was clean."

Kim, 24, agreed.

"She's my child, my daughter. You don't throw her off because she's not the same as everybody else."

Mrs. Beaton's own riding gear now is Mrs. Beaton's own. She told Kimberley what happened.

"I almost hope she won't live through the operations she needs, she said with a shocking frankness, "she'll never be like others, never marry and have a family."

BLAMES HERSELF

Anne, slight and high-strung, blames herself for causing Kimberley's deformity and says she should not have taken any drugs during her pregnancy.

"I was weak. I should have tried to be strong and get along without the sleeping pills. Now when I look at Kim I still blame myself."

The baby was several months old when Mrs. Beaton read a newspaper report dealing with deformed births believed to be caused by drugs containing thalidomide.

When her doctor told her of Kimberley's condition immediately after birth, Mrs. Beaton said it was like being "hit by a truck."

"Twenty-four hours later I asked to see only her face. But they made me look at all of her. I only saw her twice in my five days in hospital."

DIDN'T WANT CHILD

At first she did not want to keep the child. For three months a member of the Victorian Order of Nurses bathed Kimberley.

"Then it became too expensive and I had to take over. Now I'm used to her. . . I know I'd be guilty all my life if we don't do what we can for her."

Doctors said surgery will be able to straighten Kimberley's arms a little but warned the Beaton's not to hope for too much.

The girl will need five or six operations costing about \$6,000.

"She is supposed to begin them in September. We haven't got that kind of money," said Mrs. Beaton.

"If I knew I was having another child I'd have an abortion, legal or not. I won't have a child until I have absolute proof the truth has not hurt the reproductive organs. I couldn't accept another child even if it had only one finger missing."

Both parents feel the federal government must accept some responsibility for the child.

"The government accepted drugs for the Canadian market when the United States turned it down. Their responsibility is to cover expenses above the normal."

Meanwhile two members of Parliament have drafted immediate action by the federal government.

James Walker, Liberal member for Toronto's York Centre, has sent a telegram to Prime Minister Diefenbaker urging on.
