Hundreds In King's County Ready For Opening Of Lobster Season Today

"At high noon today lobster lines will be run, marking the beginning of another two-month season. Although the season begins officially on May 1, fishermen are permitted to run their lines today. Some few will undoubtedly set traps, and the first lobsters will hit the market tomorrow. However the first big haul will not be made until Monday or Tuesday after all traps are set.

Countless hundreds of traps are ready all along the north, east and south-east shore in preparation for full trap setting tomorrow and Monday. From different points boats will set out today: Wood Island, Little Sands, Beach Point, Murray Harbour, Gaspeaux, Sturgeon, Panmure Island, Lower Montague, Georgetown, DeGross, Marsh,

sought as an after dinner speaker. His extra departmental activities have brought results. He was responsible for the launching of the P. E. I. Federation of Agriculture, of which he was for a time General Secretary, and also a Director of the now viable Agricultural Council of the Province, of which he was the first President, and now Honorary President, Chairman, and members of a large number of Committees and Boards, including the Presidency of the Canadian Horticultural Council, and Chairman for some years of its Potato Committee. Past President of the Provincial Branch A. I. C.; Provincial Labor committee and representative of agriculture on the Maritime Advisory Committee to the Labor Board of the National Advisory Committee on Agricultural Services, the National Agricultural Advisory Committee, A mason and Chief of the Island Clans, and many others of a provincial and national character. In 1950 he represented the Maritime Provinces at the I.F.A.P. Conference in Sweden, and later addressed over eighty meetings on his impressions of European Agriculture.

Mr. Shaw has been decorated by their Majesties on three different occasions for meritorious services, first a Jubilee medal in 1935, second an M.B.E. and citation in 1950, and quite recently with a Coronation medal. On a number of occasions he has been offered positions outside his native Province, but he preferred to render his services in the place of his birth. His returns in an economic sense undoubtedly suffered as a result, but he built up a farm of wealth in the hearts of his people, and in their respect and affection, that provides a more lasting and satisfactory return for services rendered.

Mr. Shaw is still comparatively young, and at the full zenith of his power. Possessed of a restless, vigorous, compelling personality, it is felt that he will not drop from public life, but will continue to exert his undoubted talents in the best interests of the Provincial and Canadian pattern.

For some time he directed the Federal-Provincial Youth Training program, and his success in encouraging rural boys and girls to participate in the courses was singularly successful. The merit of his work has been chiefly responsible in elevating the Department of Agriculture of Prince Edward Island to the very front rank in the national structure. Across Canada, and beyond the field of agriculture, Walter Shaw's personality, his special qualities of heart and mind, his ability as a speaker and orator and his mature knowledge and judgement, command widespread respect and admiration.

Fat Stock Show Ass'n Meeting

Mr. Athol Roberts, Southport, was re-elected president of the P. E. I. Fat Stock Show and Sale Association when the third annual meeting was held yesterday afternoon in the board room of the City Hall. Mr. George Kitson, M.L.A., was named vice-president and Mr. Claude Paynter of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, secretary.

Directors for the coming year are Messrs. W. R. Shaw, deputy minister of Agriculture; Redvers Stewart, New Wilshire; Robert Borden, North River; Archie Johnston, Brookfield; Dan Jewell, North River; A. H. Mutch, Earscliffe; Fulton Sanderson, York Point; J. P. Lantz, Charlottetown; H. J. Kennedy, Charlottetown; Hammond Sanderson, Highfield; James Cudmore, Winsloe; S. C. Mr. Roberts in his annual report made reference to the excellent annual Fat Stock Show and sale held on April 11. He paid high tribute to the judges and the culling committee who he said "did an excellent job." He pointed out that from 100 animals entered in the show only 30 were culled. The average selling price per pound was 26.4 cents and a record for all of Canada.

Mr. Roberts expressed special appreciation to Mr. Redvers Stewart, owner of the grand champion of the show. He also extended the thanks of the Show and Sale to the members of the Exhibition Association, the auctioneer and all those who played a part in making it such a wonderful success.

Mr. Harold Heartz of the Federal Department of Agriculture in his report of the grading, said that out of 49 animals graded, 39 were class "A" which in itself was a wonderful achievement and the average carcass killed out 60%.

Discusses Gaelic Teaching In Schools Of N. S.

For the first time in Nova Scotia there will be three courses in Gaelic given this year at the summer school at Dalhousie University. Major Calum Ian MacLeod told members of the Caledonian Club of Prince Edward Island last night that Major MacLeod explained that under an amendment to the education law a qualified teacher in a Scottish district of that Province may teach Gaelic if the school trustees and inspectors for the district approve.
