Eden Suffers From Flu, May Have To Postpone Weekend Trip To Scotland

By FRASER WIGHTON LONDON (Reuters) — Sir Anthony Eden's visit to Queen Elizabeth in Scotland this weekend may have to be postponed because of an attack of influenza suffered Thursday by the Prime Minister. Eden is scheduled to spend Saturday and Sunday with the Queen at the Royal Scottish home, Balmoral Castle. Lady Eden is to accompany him. He was expected to discuss with Queen Elizabeth several changes in government personnel. These include Labor Minister Sir Walter Monckton, 63, who has been ill recently and is said to want to retire, and 73-year-old Lord Woolton, chancellor of the duchy of Lancaster and former head of the Conservative party organization. Eden came down with influenza overnight and is confined to his bed at his official country residence at Chequers.

street said he was cancelling all present engagements on medical advice. The engagements cancelled include a projected flight today to Glasgow, where he was to have lunched with the lord mayor and visited a shipyard. For the last few weeks, Eden had subjected himself to a vigorous program of official duties, which included rides in a helicopter and a jet bomber during the Farnborough air show, and a descent Wednesday into a coal mine. Apart from one cold which kept him from a cabinet meeting Eden has enjoyed excellent health since 1953, when he made a complete recovery from a serious illness. This was an attack of gall-bladder and bile duct trouble, and Eden was so ill that there were widespread rumors that his political career might be ended. After three operations he regained his health.
