JOHN MURPHY

There passed peacefully away at Charlottetown March 19th, 1962, John Murphy in his 81st year. Although in failing health for several years, his passing brought deep sorrow to the members of his family and to his many friends during his illness. He was frequently visited by the Rev. Father MacTague who administered to him the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church of which he was a devout member.

He was born in North Wiltshire in 1872, son of the late Patrick Murphy and Bridget Cahill. Most of his life was spent in Alma where he was highly respected by all who knew him. His wife predeceased him two years ago.

TORONTO, June 18—(CP)—A group of officers and directors of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce representing nine provinces left here today for an inspection of Newfoundland's industrial development.

The four-day tour is at the invitation of the Newfoundland board of trade.
