Premier Hatfield and Premier Reagan were hooked up by telephone. However, due to technical difficulties, Reagan and Hatfield were unable to participate for a portion of the show.

There were many

phone calls and questions from the audience predominantly directed to Alex Campbell. Campbell had quite adequately answered the questions pertinent to the issue.

The questions were primarily concerned with how long it would take for the government in question to make a definite decision on Maritime Union. An individual was disturbed by the red-tape involved in blocking, unnecessarily, a definite decision. He went further to state that the issue had been tossed around for a hundred years already and it was high time the premiers of the provinces concerned had come to a decision. Each government had a responsibility to their representatives to see that maritime union would be beneficial to each area concerned.
