

Foreign News Notes.

The French force at present in Tonquin is estimated at 10,000 men.

It is expected that President Arthur will discuss the question of tariff revision in his forthcoming message.

A report has reached Paris, and is generally believed, that the French have sustained a defeat in Tonquin.

Small stove coal is so scarce in the Philadelphia region that operators refuse to take orders for this month's delivery.

Marquis Tseng, the Chinese ambassador to Paris, is stated to have been educated by the Jesuits, and is a member of the order.

A female nihilist was hanged in St. Petersburg, on Thursday, 15th inst., having been convicted of complicity with plots of the organization.

The nuptials of Prince Louis of Battenburg and Princess Victoria of Hesse will be celebrated at Darmstadt in February next. The Prince of Wales is present.

A young man was arrested at Paris on Monday while trying to make his way into the presence of the French Prime Minister, Ferry, whom he said he had been instructed by a secret organization to murder.

It is stated that if the Suez Canal Company accepts the proposition of the English shipowners for the management of the Canal the English Government will advance £8,000,000 to aid in the construction of the second canal.

A loaded revolver has wonderful persuasive power. A Pennsylvania clergyman experienced this when a desperado stood before him and urged him to perform the marriage service between himself and a wealthy deaf and dumb girl.

A Madrid despatch says the Prime Minister has received telegrams from various public bodies in Barcelona expressing regret that the route of the Crown Prince of Germany has been changed, and assuring him that Barcelona would have given the Prince an enthusiastic reception.

Panama advices state that the question of the Presidential succession of the Republic of Columbia will probably lead to bloodshed. The opponent of Dr. Nunez, the President-elect, declaring that he was not fairly elected. Both sides are making overtures to the army to secure its support.

A Vienna despatch says:—The projected journey of the Crown Prince of Germany causes uneasiness here. It is not forgotten that a Spanish quarrel led to the war of 1870. It is feared that King Alfonso has not enough hold upon his people to secure the German Crown Prince against insult, which would upset the work of years, and terminate all assurances of peace.

Home News Items.

Bow Park farm has been successful in taking four first prizes at the Chicago Fat Stock show with only two animals exhibited.

Reports from points in Ontario state that six to eighteen inches of snow have fallen. The temperature at some points in Central Ontario is eight degrees above zero.

The Minister of Militia, the Speaker of the House of Commons, and Major-General Laurie, are spoken of in connection with the presidency of the Dominion Rifle Association, vacant by the resignation of Col. Gzowski.

In the Eastern townships a new cloth factory is being established. In Toronto a felt hat manufacturing company has just been incorporated. In Kingston they are commencing to make oilcloths. In Winnipeg an agricultural implement factory is to be opened. All of which is unpleasant news for the politicians who are laboring to promote the interests of American manufacturers.

Charles Hammond, an American confidence operator, who robbed parties on the train and at wharves of considerable sums giving them bogus mining bonds in return, has been sentenced by a Montreal Judge to three years in the penitentiary. Lewis Edwin Sanford, who forged a check on the Bank of Toronto for \$100, and who is wanted in England and the United States on similar charges, received a sentence of five years in the penitentiary.

A bona fide settler squatted on land near Calgary in 1882, and left it for a time while he went east for implements and stock. On his return to Calgary he found that his lot was covered by a grazing lease. But he took possession, and the holders of the lease endeavored to eject him by legal process. The case came before Stipendiary Magistrate McLeod, and a jury, by whom it was decided that the squatter was entitled to the land. This shows that the law, however it may affect the speculative squatter, protects the man whose intentions are honorable.

At the second annual convention of the Quebec Dairyman's Association the Society was reported in a prosperous condition. The main object of the meeting was to study the best means of developing the dairy interests in Quebec Province, and papers were read on "cattle," "lactometers, creamometers, and lactoscopes, their construction and how to use them. Mr. W. H. Lynch, of Danville, lectured on "butter-making." He exhibited an improved set of dairy utensils and a scientific outfit to illustrate his system; the essential point in which is that he makes butter-making more a question of mechanical appliance than manual skill. He would introduce a model dairy in each farm-house rather than look to the education of a few students.

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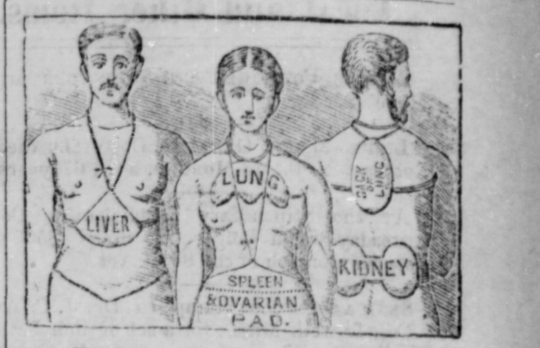
