French Franc Is Devalued

PARIS (AP) — A series of measures that add up to a 20-per-cent devaluation of the franc for most sections of the French economy went into effect Sunday.

The French government announced the measures Saturday night in a move to beef up the country's ailing economy.

Tourists and other individuals and businesses bringing foreign currency into France will get a 20-per-cent premium over the official rate of 350 francs to the dollar.

Each of their dollars will buy 40 francs, just about the going rate of the Paris black market.

French tourists and businessmen travelling abroad will have to pay 20 per cent extra for their foreign currencies.

BUFFALO N.Y. (AP) — The bankrupt Everybody's Daily, largest Polish newspaper in the United States, has published its last edition. The paper, billed as "Buffalo's only daily newspaper," was founded half a century ago in October. Circulation in recent years was about 30,000.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. FRANK MACDONALD.
The communities of Crapaud and the neighbouring districts were shocked on Wednesday morning, July 17, to hear of the passing of Mrs. Frank MacDonald at her home after a brief illness.

The deceased was born to the late Mr. Angus MacDonald and Mrs. Annie Lea Lord MacDonald, sixty-four years ago. In Tryon, she attended the district school, after which she entered Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, where she received her first class teacher's license.

After teaching in several rural schools she went to Crapaud to reside after her marriage in 1917. The many floral tributes for one whose life was given in loving service to the home, the church, and the community testified to the esteem in which the deceased was held.

Mrs. MacDonald was a woman of diversified talents and interests.

Among the latter was the women's institute of which she was a charter member of the Crapaud branch and its first president. For the past many years she acted in the capacity of secretary. In a recent provincial Women's Institute poetry contest, Mrs. MacDonald was awarded first prize. This spring she was active in completing the history of Crapaud, which has been entered in the Lord Tweedsmuir community history competition. The local public library and the South Shore Festival were among other special interests in which she held executive positions.

The deceased was an active member of the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church at Crapaud, as well as being a church member.

Besides her sorrowing husband there are left to cherish her memory three daughters, Mrs. Ralph Myers (Jean), Crapaud; Mrs. Arnold Taylor (Annalee) of Kitchener, Ontario; Mrs. Randolph Wats (Margaret), Sudbury Ontario; and one son, Norman, on the homestead; eight grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Liede Profit, Melville, Saskatchewan; and two brothers, Harry, in Victoria, B.C., and Kenneth in Borden.

Following prayers at the residence, the largely attended funeral service was held in the Crapaud United Church, with the Rev. A.D.C. Earl officiating. The choir led in the singing of the hymns "Unto The Hills" and "My Faith Looks Up To Thee", under the direction of the organist, Dr. Peter MacDonald, who accompanied the soloist, Mrs. L. M. Calbeck, as she sang "Face to Face".

The pallbearers were Messrs. Warren Lord, Frank Myers, Stuart Sherren, Murdoch MacLeod, Kenneth Mutari, and Clayton Morrison. Interment was in the Church Cemetery.
