

Civil Rights Heads Expect Upsurge In Demonstrations

NEW YORK (AP) — Civil rights leaders foresee an increase in anti-segregationist demonstrations this summer — with potentially greater violence — and a trend toward "extremism" among both Negroes and whites, an Associated Press survey showed Sunday.

"It's going to be a long, hot summer," said Volma Overton, Texas official of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

A number of those interviewed used the same phrase: "An overwhelming majority condemned 'nuisance tactics' — such as jamming traffic to the New York world's fair, and letting water faucets run in New York."

The consensus: 1. Demonstrations will increase in number and intensity north and south. Employment practices affecting Negroes is the sore point in the north. In the south, the problem pivots on voting rights and the slow pace of desegregating the schools.

2. An overwhelming majority condemned "nuisance tactics" — such as jamming traffic to the New York world's fair, and letting water faucets run in New York.

3. The majority said they approve of civil disobedience where state or local laws are "unjust," designed to discriminate against one segment of society, or in conflict with the constitution.

4. The majority agreed that

"extremism" is increasing to anti-segregationist organizations.

Virtually all the replies mentioned the civil rights bill as the key to what could develop in the field of race relations in the near future.

End Of Draft Study Ordered By Johnson

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson has ordered a sweeping study of military manpower policies to determine whether the U.S. draft can be eliminated in the 1970s.

Johnson made the announcement Saturday at his second press conference in three days, this one a 35-minute session in his office, not announced in advance.

The president said Defense Secretary McNamara will undertake the one-year study to "consider alternatives to the present draft selection system, including the possibility of meeting our requirements on an entirely voluntary basis in the next decade."

Asked whether this forecast allows a cutback in military strength, the president said: "I wouldn't want to anticipate the results of that study. . . of course it is the hope of everyone that tensions in the world can ease, that we can bring about disarmament, that we can take part of the resources that are now going into military production and protection and spend them on a better society and a greater society."

Draft calls this year have run between 12,000 and 16,000 monthly.

Bennett Likes Pension Plan

VICTORIA (CP) — Premier W.A.C. Bennett said here he is pleased with new Canada Pension Plan proposals he has received from Prime Minister Pearson.

Mr. Bennett said the prime minister has sent him a 7½-page telegram on the pension plan and "other fiscal matters."

The premier said he couldn't divulge contents of the telegram since it was marked "personal and confidential."

But he told reporters, "you can see I'm smiling."

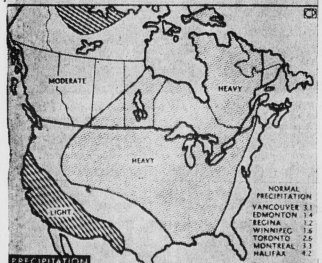
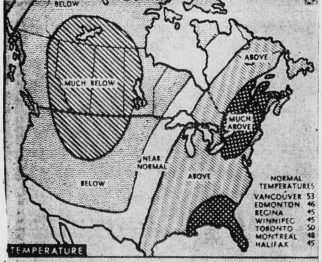
