SERIOUS FIRE AT NEW ARGYLE.

Very serious consequences resulted yesterday from the kindling of a loaf fire that was started by some men who were clearing land at New Argyle. The fire, which was of considerable dimensions when the match was applied, soon got beyond the control of the men who started it, and spread to the fences surrounding the fields nearby.

Then it rapidly extended on all sides and burnt everything in its path for a length of about one mile and an almost corresponding width. The woods and fences in the track were entirely consumed and, most unfortunate of all, seven buildings were burnt to the ground, to the loss of their owners. Those who thus suffered are: Alex. McDougall; whose dwelling house and barn were destroyed, as well as an unoccupied house and another barn owned by him; John McDougall, whose house and barn were also burned; John Inman, who lost a fine new barn; and Charles McLean, whose barn was destroyed by the flames. Mr. Alexander McDougall's loss is most severe; he was away fishing when the fire attacked his premises, and consequently he saved very little of his property in either house or barn.

THE SEWERAGE—Work was commenced this morning at the corner of Grafton and Great George Street to connect the Post Office with the sewerage.

FIRE ENGINE TESTED—A test was given the Sibley fire engine yesterday on Market Square. It was satisfactory, a stream of water being thrown high over the Market House.

PUMPING STATION—Repairing is going forward rapidly at the pumping station. The two pumps are now working. A roof has not yet been built over the station, but material is being obtained for it.

SERVICE AT ST. PETERS—Rev. J. A. McNeill, Orwell, conducts the services in St. Peter's congregation on Sabbath next. 3rd prox.—hours and places of preaching as follows: Head of Bay, 11 o'clock; north side 3, and Marie 7, p. m.

MEETING—The annual meeting of the First Methodist Church Sabbath School was held last evening. The reports from the different departments showed the school to be in a flourishing condition, the average attendance for the year being higher than previous years.

POLICE COURT—This morning Peter Keenan was fined \$10 or 60 days for drunkenness. Louis McLean was fined \$4 or 20 days for assault. Colin McGregor, for causing disturbance at Salvation Army Barracks, was fined \$5 or 30 days. All who hereafter cause such disturbances will be similarly dealt with.

ISLANDERS AT MOUNT ALLISON—At the Mount All on convocation, last Tuesday, the degree of B. A. was conferred upon L. W. Lodge, Charlottetown. In the Ladies' College, Miss Edith Moore, of Eldon, secured one of the J. W. Smith essay prizes for class work. In third year work, Miss W. Brocken, Charlottetown won the prize for English.

A DEEP SEA MONSTER—M. Praught and F. Shiverree two fishermen in the employ of D. Murphy, Esq., East Point, on Saturday the 19th inst, caught a lobster in one of their traps measuring 26 inches from tip of tail to end of claws, 15-inch girt around the body, and the claws when extended showed a spread of 29 inches. He tipped the scale at ten pounds. Such a monster had not been caught in these waters for years. Fishing promises good at East Point this season as boats are landing from 1000 to 1200 lbs. daily, weather permitting.
