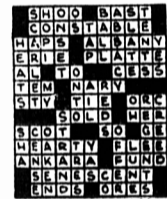
### O'Leary and Vicinity

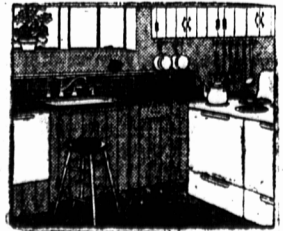
