Story Forms Big Part Of Island's Heritage

Woven into the fabric of the great new series, The Fathers of Confederation, which starts this week in The Evening Patriot, there is the story of the Island's greatest moment in history and one of the richest features of its heritage. Everything that Canada is celebrating this year in P. E. I. enters into the series.

For it pictures and describes the 23 men who "built better than they knew" at the Charlottetown Confederation Conference in 1864—the 10 who were added to their group for the subsequent gathering in Quebec—shows them and describes them as they were then, and in a way that never before has been done.

Seven of the 33 sections of the series are devoted to the men who spoke for the Island at those two gatherings.

The whole meaning of the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Centre now nearing completion in Charlottetown, and of all the festivities under way this year on the Island, goes back to the men who are made recognizable through this series.
