

PRAYER SEEN ANSWERED

MONTREAL (CP)—It looks like Rev. Bertrand Marie Boulay's prayers carry a lot of weight.

Father Boulay, Roman Catholic chaplain of the Montreal police department, lost his wallet to a pickpocket last Tuesday while riding a bus. The priest said losing the \$10 in money didn't bother him so much as losing his papers and badge.

Mayor Eases Race Problem

TRENTON, N.J. (AP)—Mayor Arthur J. Holland, who moved into a racially-mixed, deteriorating neighborhood, says he has a pleasant relationship with his neighbors.

When he walks through his neighborhood, the youngsters treat him as they would their favorite baseball player.

"Hi, Mayor Holland," they shout, giving a big wave and a broad smile.

"It makes you feel good," Holland said proudly.

His move six months ago into the integrated neighborhood not far from city hall still raises some eyebrows. But the novelty is wearing off in a city where 20 per cent of the 114,000 residents are non-white.

It may be coincidental but New Jersey's capital city has been free of racial rioting that has plagued large industrial cities in the northern part of the state.

However, Holland said there is a "hate" group in the city that has circulated leaflets saying the mayor's wife Betty and their two small daughters get out of the house when the mayor is away. Holland said he would not dignify the group's attacks on him by replying.

The mayor and his wife don't see their move as part of an integrationist crusade. Instead, they view it as a personal commitment in the campaign for urban renewal. They hope to convince others to stay in the city rather than move to the suburbs.

Site Selected For Copper Mill

VANCOUVER (CP) — A site for a proposed 1,000-ton-a-day mill has been selected at Earliest Resources Ltd. copper property in San Pedro, N.M., the company said Tuesday.

The Vancouver-based mining firm said preliminary drilling showed "average over 75 feet of the 110-foot hole . . . 1.28 per cent copper plus gold values averaging over \$1 per ton."

A 42-foot section of the first hole assayed 2.22 per cent copper a ton.

Earl Oils, president of Earliest, said feasibility reports indicate 2,500,000 tons of ore "in eight, or enough to carry on for eight years."

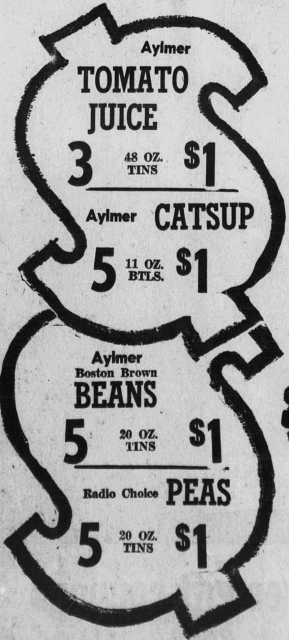

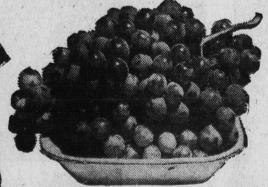
