



# Drowned In Ditch Is Jury's Verdict

"William Russell MacDonald, 54, Charlottetown, came to his death by drowning while in an intoxicated condition, between 12.30 and 9 a.m. May 2, 1963, in the ditch in the vicinity of Marshfield School," was the verdict returned by a coroner's jury last evening.

At the inquest which was held in City Hall and presided over by chief coroner, Dr. L. R. Prowse, 14 witnesses were called to give testimony. The Crown was represented by Alan K. Seales.

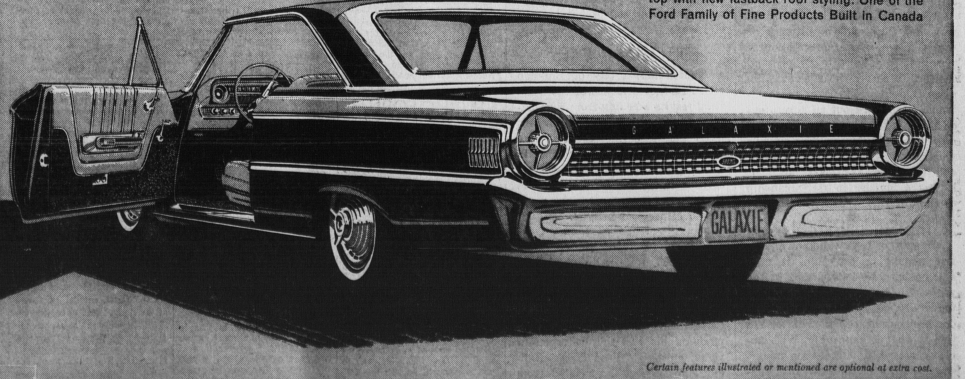
