## Contract for Printing New Edition of the Statutes of Prince Edward Island, for the Years 1863, 1864, 1865, 1866, and 1867.

PERSONS disposed to Contract for Printing Eight Hundred Copies of the Revised Public General Statutes and One Hundred and Fifty Copies of the Revised Private Statutes, of Prince Edward Island, passed in the years 1863, 1864, 1865, 1866, and 1867, and for binding the same, are hereby informed that TENDERS will be received by the undersigned Commissioners, appointed to superintend the same, until twelve o'clock, noon, on Saturday, the Sixteenth day of November, instant.

The Public and Private Statutes will form two separate volumes, comprising 280 pages and 170 pages, or thereabouts, respectively, and will form two separate volumes.

Tenders to express the rate per sheet of eight pages for each volume. The contractor will be required to print the Public Statutes first, and to complete the same within Three Months after commencing it, which he will be required to do on or about the 7th day of December next; and to complete the Private Statutes within Three Months thereafter. Both works to be printed in a good and workmanlike manner, in the style of the Revised Statutes of Prince Edward Island published in 1862, a specimen of which as well as of the binding and of the quality of the paper, may be seen and other particulars made known at the Office of Hon. Joseph Hensley, one of the Commissioners, where Sealed Tenders, directed to the undersigned, are to be sent.

Separate Tenders to be sent in for the Printing, and separate Tenders for the Binding of the work; and the Tenders for the Binding to set forth the rate per volume at which the Contractor or Contractors will half bind the same in Calf, and half bind the same in Sheep.

No Tender will be noticed unless accompanied by a letter addressed to the Commissioners, signed, if in reference to the Printing, by two (2) persons, and if in reference to the Binding, by two (2) persons of known responsibility, engaging to become security for the due performance of the contract.

## TENDERS.

### Tenders for Dredging the Southport and Charlottetown sides of Charlottetown Ferry.

SEPARATE Tenders are required to be sent into the Colonial Secretary's Office, on or before THURSDAY, the Fourteenth day of January next, at twelve o'clock, noon, by any person or company who may be willing to contract with the Government to perform the three following works, that is to say:—

1st. To dredge the Southport side of the Charlottetown Ferry, as follows:—A channel to be cut through the flats from the main channel to the landing slip at the Southport side; the first 150 feet, leading from the main channel, to be dredged out 3 feet deep, and 60 feet wide.

2ndly. The remaining distance up to the outer edge of the stationary Wharf and under the Floating Blocks, (supposed to be about 400 feet), to be dredged out 2 feet deep throughout, and 60 feet wide, up to the docks, and from side to side within the docks.

3rdly. The public docks, on the Charlottetown side of said Ferry, to be dredged out and deepened in same manner from

side to side, three feet deep at the least, from the end of the slip to the channel.

The above works to be respectively completed, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Public Works, or other person or persons appointed by the Government to inspect the same, on or before the First day of October, A. D. 1868.

The soil dredged out to be removed and deposited in such a place as not to obstruct the navigation of the Hillsboro' or other rivers.

Tenders to be accompanied by the names of two sufficient securities for the due performance of the above Contracts.

The Government is not to be considered as bound to accept the lowest Tender in any case.
