General Orders.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF.

NO. 1.—The Regimental limits of the 4th Queen's County Regiment of Militia being too extended, they are hereby altered and a new Regiment constituted, to be styled the 7th Queen's County Regiment of Militia.

These two Regiments will be divided by the boundary line between Lots 33 and 34.

The 4th Queen's County Regiment will comprise all the Companies to the westward of that line in Lots 23, 24 & 33.

The 7th Queen's County Regiment will comprise all the Companies to the eastward of that line in Lots 34, 35, 36 and 37.

The commanding Officers will make such alterations in the Company limits as are rendered necessary by this redistribution.

NO. 2.—1st Queen's County Regiment of Militia, Captains J. B. Cooper and G. L. Dogherty to be Majors.

Ensigns M. Fitzgerald and W. Haszard to be Lieutenants, vice Thomas Lowrie and R. Fitzgerald, promoted.

Benjamin Desbrisay and W. C. White, Gents, to be Ensigns.

NO. 3.—4th Queen's County Regiment of Militia, Captain Charles Buxton from the unattached list, to be Adjutant vice Hudson, who retires.

NO. 4.—6th Queen's County Regiment of Militia—Captain R. W. Brecken and James Peake to be Majors.

Lieutenants E. Purdy and F. S. Moore, from 1st Queen's County Regiment, to be Captains vice R. W. Brecken and James Peake, promoted.

Ensigns B. Davies and R. Morrison to be Lieutenants, vice E. Purdy and F. S. Moore, promoted.

Ralph Peake and R. Harris, Gents, to be Ensigns.

NO. 5.—7th Queen's County Regiment of Militia—Major John A. McDonald, from the 4th Queen's County Regiment, to be Lieutenant Colonel.

NO. 6.—1st King's County Regiment of Militia—Captain Charles Owen to be Adjutant.

NO. 7.—4th King's County Regiment of Militia—To be acting Captain-Lieutenant, Lauchlan McDonald vice Emanuel McEachern, promoted.

To be acting Lieutenant, Ensign Donald Stewart vice Lauchlan McDonald, promoted.

To be acting Ensign, Sergeant Alexander Bruce vice Donald Stewart, promoted.

NOTICE is hereby given that the new Rifle Range has been established on the field generally known as "White's Shipyard." The firing will take place in the direction of the Hillsborough River. Captains commanding Companies of Volunteer Militia are held responsible that prior to commencing firing, the Red or Danger Flag is hoisted, and that a similar flag shall, from the markers' butts, give notice to cease firing whenever a boat or stray cattle are seen approaching the range. The firing is also to be suspended on any intimation to that effect from the Shipyard. All firing is to take place under the command of responsible Officers. Individual and parties making use of the range will be liable to prosecution for trespass.
